

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR



Birdsong greeted me when I let our dog out this morning. It was still dark and rainy, but the sound was unmistakable and clear — several finches chirping to welcome the morning. Their song was a welcome sound. Peaceful. As if the world were turning softly and predictably in its orbit. Peaceful, before plugging in and reading the morning headlines with bitter news of waging ideologies.

The simple song of the birds calmed me. It was, for that moment, the voice of the eternal, the source of life, the faithful one who, again and again, grants the world one more day. Grants us one more day in hopes that we might learn to sing as the birds sing — a song of peace.


CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKETS

CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKETS: HEARTS IN ACTION

Did you know that one in six Washingtonians relies on a local food bank to meet their nutritional needs? A few bags of groceries might not seem like much, but to those who struggle to put food on the table it can make a world of difference. That's why this year, on one day, Advent Lutheran's Christmas Food Baskets Ministry will provide more than 225 local families with the ingredients for a traditional holiday

meal. But we can't do it without you!



To bag, please arrive at Advent by 8:30 a.m. on December 16th and join the human assembly line in the Fellowship Hall. We'll be packing more than 700 grocery bags. Each family will receive about 20 food items, including a turkey, milk, stuffing mix, cranberry sauce, cake mix/frosting, rolls, fresh vegetables, and more. Bagging, typically, takes less than an hour and a half. If you also plan to be

a delivery driver, please check in at the Driver's Table in the narthex before joining the assembly line. After you finish bagging, you'll head to the sanctuary for instructions and to pick up your delivery packets. To volunteer to bag, please contact Carolyn Johnson at smith22307@comcast.net.

Those who want to be delivery drivers should **check in at the Driver's Table in the narthex by 9:45 a.m.**There will be a short meeting in the sanctuary to provide important instructions. Most deliveries are within a fifteen-minute drive of Advent and families will be expecting you. If you'd like to be a delivery driver, please contact Trudi Trueit at author@truditrueit.com or plug in her email address at Signupgenius.com to find the list and add your name.

This ministry is completely funded by your donations! The Food Baskets Committee is working to raise \$11,000 to purchase food from the Navy commissary in Marysville. Each basket cost about \$50, but any amount is appreciated. If you'd like to contribute, please mark your check *Christmas Food Baskets* before placing it in the offering plate.

Many local businesses are also donating supplies and services, including Central Market, Lowes, Costco, Top Pot, and Staples. Thanks to the caring members of Advent and our community partners, nearly 900 people in our area will be able to sit down

to a traditional meal this holiday season they might not otherwise have. Thank you!

November Update from Council President

The Council met on Tuesday, November 21st. Fred Row led devotions that centered around the meaning of Advent. The Church divides the year into different seasons that emphasize the life of Christ and the life of the Church. Beginning on Sunday December 3rd, 2017, we will enter the season of the Church year called Advent. Advent is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas, and continuing to Epiphany.

Pastor Scott reported updates on visitations to members who are experiencing illness or loss of loved ones and friends. There are 13 youth who have registered for the National Youth Gathering in Houston this summer. The Gathering is held every three years, and 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from Evangelical Lutheran Churches across America, gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering.

The youth have planned a major fund raiser as part of our Annual January meeting, they'll be introducing it in January.

The October 17th Minutes were approved as written, as was the October Financial Report. Total income for the month of October was \$39,648 which was slightly less than the projected monthly budget by \$3,680. The \$5,000 transferred from savings last month was redeposited in the saving account. A detailed financial report has been posted on the Council bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall as well as a copy of the October minutes.

The Council reviewed and approved the proposed 2018 budget that will be presented at the January 28th Annual meeting for Congregational Approval. *Budget forums will be scheduled during January to allow members to review and ask questions about the proposed budget.* The budget includes projected revenue and expenditures of \$542,696. This is an increase of \$22,766 over the 2017 budget. It includes the addition of the Full Charge Book-keeper's annual salary. The approved 2017 budget included salary for the Full Charge Book-keeper's salary during the last quarter of the year. It also allocates funds for the possibility of adding a Youth and Family staff person in the fourth quarter. *Want to learn specific details? Plan to attend the January budget forums!*

Building the Church budget is a leap of faith activity. This is because the Council must use income that is projected based on annualization of past years revenue above and beyond pledges received. Advent's 2018 Stewardship Drive ended on Reformation Sunday. We received 85 pledge cards this year, for total pledged dollars of \$270,848. However, it still isn't too late to submit your pledge card if you haven't yet done so. Pledge cards are located on the office counter in the Fellowship Hall and on the table in the Sanctuary Narthex.

The meeting adjourned following The Lord's Prayer.
