A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOF



Christmas and the New Year do not mean that all is right with the world. That is clearly not the case. Humanity has a long way to go before swords are beaten into plowshares and the atmosphere of divisiveness in politics and race is eased.

But something is right with the world. It is a season where we hope for peace. It is a season where we think of generosity. It is a season where we value kindness.

Some things are right in the world. Gifts have been given to the community through the Food Bank and Everybody's Closet. Gifts of warmth and care have been given to the world through the work of the quilters. Gifts of time and concern and joy have been given in meals served at the Everett Gospel Mission. The gift of a complete Christmas dinner, along with grace and love, have been provided for families struggling to make ends meet with the Christmas Baskets. The gift of music and community and talent has been given as we have listened together to the choir join their voices together to bring exquisite beauty to the world. Some things are right with the world.

Religious communities have gathered in this darkest time of the year to light candles and speak about light for our darkness. Families have come together to enjoy and build the ties of love. We have practiced the art and the value and the faith of giving. Some things are right with the world.

Yes, hate and intolerance seem to be on the rise. Yes, violence still plagues the human community. And, yes, families still struggle to be kind to one another. But some things are right with the world. And it is far more than that the sun still shines and that rains come. It is far more than the presence of teachers and healers and givers in our midst. It is the persistent presence of the words and remembrance of this child of Bethlehem – and of the teachers and prophets who went before him.

The Voice of God continues to speak to us, continues to call to us, continues to challenge and summon us to realize in our lives what is good and right and noble. The Voice of God speaks of heaven's faithfulness and calls us to faithfulness to one another. The Voice of God speaks words of healing and bids us be healers. The Voice of God speaks mercy and summons us to mercy. The Voice of God speaks forgiveness – release from the brokenness we have brought to our relationship with God and the earth, our neighbor and ourselves – and bids us do the same.

Some things are right with the world. And our simple act of coming together to hear the ancient stories, to sing the songs new and old, and to share fresh baked bread around a table where all are welcome reminds us of what is good, of what we could be, of what we should be. And maybe, before the New Year gets too far underway, we can hold on for a moment to what is noble and true, to the vision of our true humanity presented to us in this Jesus, to the desire to be governed by His Spirit, and to see the fruit of that Spirit in our lives, to the hope and presence of peace.

National Youth Gathering Fundraiser in January — 128 Envelopes

Watch for 128 Envelopes to appear! Advent Lutheran Youth are raising funds to help defray the cost of their trip to the National Youth Gathering in

Houston this summer. Check out the Youth Table in the Fellowship Hall where they'll have 128 envelopes available starting January 14th. The Youth chose "128" to coincide with the date of the Congregational Annual Meeting on 1/28.

Each envelope is numbered, and represents a dollar amount from \$1 to \$128. By taking an envelope, you are making a commitment to return the envelope with that amount. So, if you have the number 1, you are committing to collecting or donating \$1. For 2, \$2 and so on. The highest numbered envelope is 128, so the maximum commitment is \$128.

If all envelopes are returned with the corresponding amount contributed we will raise over \$8,000 toward our service trip to the National Youth Gathering! Please consider taking an envelope (or two!, or three!), and place cash or check inside and return to the Youth Table or to the Church Office.

Christmas Food Baskets Help Brighten the Holidays

Advent's annual Christmas Food Baskets event was a huge success! More than one hundred volunteers turned out on an overcast, chilly Saturday morning in mid-December to pack nearly

700 grocery bags bound for local families. The human assembly line stretched out of the Fellowship Hall!

Each basket contained about twenty items, including a turkey, milk, stuffing, gravy, rolls, butter, cranberry sauce, and potatoes. Once the 'baskets' were complete, delivery drivers convened in the sanctuary for a brief service with Pastor Scott and pianist Eva Mahaffey before heading out to make their rounds. Advent partnered with local churches, schools, and Vol-



unteers of America to identify recipient families, who were expecting the baskets.

The Food Baskets Committee is grateful to everyone who supported the ministry. Special thanks to the Classics for their donation and musicians Jeff Rohr and Emily Hamner, who gave a fundraising concert. Sunday School students crafted Christmas cards to include in the baskets. Boy Scouts, Girls Scouts, and youth members helped assemble baskets, load cars, and deliver. All the food was purchased through the U.S. Navy Commissary in Marysville and



transported courtesy of Coastwide Laboratories, a division of Staples. Additionally, Central Market in Mill



Creek donated grocery bags, Lowes lent Advent several large carts to load groceries, Costco handled recycling, and Top Pot Doughnuts supplied donuts and coffee for volunteers.

Whether you made a contribution, helped fill bags, were a delivery driver, or all of the above, your efforts meant that more than one thousand people in our area were able to enjoy a traditional holiday meal. Thank you, Advent!
