PASTOR A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

We take vacations now, we don't go on pilgrimage. I don't think it's just that there is no credit to be gained in heaven for visiting a holy site or a holy relic, and it's not just that we no longer expect God to meet us in certain holy places – I worry that we no longer expect God to meet us at all.

In some ways it is good that the idea of holy place has been replaced by a notion that God can meet us anywhere. But nothing is gained if every place becomes absent of God rather than full of God.

It's one of the enduring elements of the Reformation that we do not need a priest or holy person to speak to God on our behalf; we are bid to speak to God as a child to their loving parent. But nothing is gained if we do not open that conversation. And it's part of the genius of the Reformation that the place we serve God – our altar – is not the table in the sanctuary, but the kitchen table where we serve our family, and the desk, machine or tractor where we serve our neighbor through our work. I fear that we too easily forget that the place where we work and live and love is holy, that the sacred gets swallowed up by the profane rather than the profane being sanctified.

We describe Lent as a journey, taking the 40 days of Lent from the 40 days of Jesus in the wilderness, which is itself taken from the 40 years of Israel journeying towards the Promised Land. It's not for us a physical pilgrimage, taken by foot over hill and dale toward that place where we hope to be touched by the transcendent power of God. It's an invitation to a spiritual journey in the expectation that forty days from now, in the water washing our feet, the bread broken and placed in our hands, the altar stripped, the wooden cross

set before the altar, and the procession into the church through the waters of baptism into the full light of Easter – in those wondrous three days God will meet us anew in ways rich with meaning for our lives.

The majestic view is made sweeter by the climb to the mountain top. The journey through airports and foreign streets provides a time for leaving the old behind to be ready to welcome the new vistas of new places. The journey prepares us for the encounter. And so we speak of the journey of Lent: the spiritual journey of prayer, reflection, study, worship, simplicity, charity. The journey of daily mindfulness of the presence of God. The journey into a deeper awareness of Heaven's grace. The journey into a fuller participation in the mission of God's dawning reign.

"Creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God," writes Paul. I think he has in mind the fullness of God's kingdom when Christ is all in all. But I suspect it is also true that the world yearns for Christians to be Christians, for us to walk the walk, not just talk the talk, for us to be agents of healing and grace in a world short of both. The drive through town and the walk from the parking lot to the sanctuary is not an arduous journey toward a place where I expect to be in the presence of the holy. But it can be part of that greater pilgrimage in which I am ever more deeply conformed to the image of Christ.

Lent reminds us that this is our calling. Glad to be on the journey with you,



Know what you are for!

I have been told that the phrases, "Do not be afraid" and "Have no fear" appear in the Bible 365 times. While I have never counted them for myself, it is a fitting idea that there would be one



for each day of the year. No doubt it is a central message of the scriptures proclaimed in both the Christmas and Easter stories.

God knows us so very well. God knows that we tend to become focused upon the things that frighten us. We develop a form of tunnel vision which prevents us from seeing what life is giving around us. Most importantly, fear short circuits our ability to put our trust in God. "Do not be afraid. I go before you always." Deuteronomy 31.8

It is a teaching that speaks to the uncertainty and fear that many are experiencing in today's hyped political world of uncertainty.

I spent a few days in Olympia in my role as a trustee in our Community and Technical College system. I spoke to multiple legislators who told me there is a growing interest in Town Hall Meetings and other kinds of public gatherings. More and more people are asking the question, "What can we do as concerned citizens?" I am keenly aware that many people in our churches are asking this same question. I want to suggest that we not forget the words spoken throughout history by angels and prophets alike, "Do not be afraid."

In late January, I attended the International Holocaust Commemoration Day event at Seattle University. Jewish author and holocaust survivor George Elbaum shared his personal story of how fear can lead people to develop a form of hate that has no limits. George, his voice cracking from the pain that still resides in his soul, shared this wisdom with the students, "Know what you are *for*, not what you are *against*." He went on to explain how people who are only against always rely upon fear as their method of persuasion.

I find this to be a helpful guide in trying to navigate the times we are living in. It gives us a helpful frame in which to be clear about our own beliefs and can assist us in understanding our neighbor who may see the world differently.

It calls us not to be against another person, race, gender, or nation but to strive together to discover what is it we are for. Try this out for the next 365 days and let's see what we learn.


The Garden of Giving has rested over the winter, but with the Spring is beginning to awaken! The Garden will have its first work party on Thursday morning, March 16.
