A MESSAGE FROM OUR

PASTOR PROM OUR



"Very truly, I tell you, the hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live." —John 5:25

John doesn't give us the name of the paralyzed man who lies at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-25). This is not a story about one specific person; this is a story about all of us.

We have water in our homes. We do not have to go to a public pool to get water for cooking and cleaning. Water is always at hand. Water that is safe, potable, and abundant, even despite the long dry summer.

Water is work for much of the world. And the place where water is gathered is a public place. So it makes perfect sense that the lame would lie there hoping for the kindness of strangers.

But this particular pool in Jerusalem is not just about the kindness of strangers; it is a place where people hope for the kindness of God.

Every now and then ripples fan out across the waters of this pool. Jerusalem is an earthquake zone like ours, but where we would assume some minor tremor has stirred the water, they saw the hand of the divine. For a moment, for a brief shining moment, those waters quivered with the power of the transcendent. For a flash in time, heaven had touched earth, and all the radiant glory and power of heaven was there to be received. For a brief moment the door was opened to healing.

But it's a thin hope. It's healing only for one, only for the first. Healing for the quick and the strong, or for those with someone to help them get to the water fast. For the man Jesus meets, mercy always happens to someone else.

This paralyzed man has lost hope. He has lost faith in the possibility that he might know heaven's touch, that he might find new life. This is the danger of guilt and shame and the overwhelming nature of all life's misfortune – that we might lose faith in the possibility that we might know heaven's touch.

But we are witnesses to the empty tomb.

Hope is not built on sand; it does not depend upon us. It is not the product of our strength or skill, our ability to think positively, our ability to negotiate the trials of life. Hope is not built on our plans and preparations, but the discarded grave cloths on that empty rock bench. It is carved out of rock and has no door.

And hope is not the privilege of the few. The five loaves fed 5,000. The wine at Cana lightened the hearts of all. The mercy of God is scattered abundantly without regard for what may fall upon the path or get eaten by birds. The open tomb tells of a prodigal God. Before us stands the Son, crucified and risen. Before all who live in death's shadow he stands. And he speaks. And those who hear are grasped by that life which never perishes.

Come be part of that life here at Advent, especially as your busy schedules come back to life this Fall.

September Update from Council President

The Council met on Tuesday, August 15 for a combined mini social, mini retreat and August Council meeting. The gathering began with a bar-b-que social hour. Following dinner, Pastor Scott opened the retreat with a prayer followed by an activity around Leadership and what is meant by it. Bill Case then provided devotions. A review and discussion around the roles and responsibilities of elected council officers and ministry liaisons, including reimbursement procedures for Ministry Teams and Council Members was led by me.

Kim Hall facilitated a review activity around Advent's Constitution and By-Laws. The final retreat activity included a beginning review and discussion about Advent's Mission and Value's statements. The current document describing our Mission, Values and Vision is three pages. The Council would like to try and get it to one page for better communicating what we are about and to eliminate redundancy.

The Council broke into two groups for the beginning discussions around the document and Pastor Scott circulated between groups. He was amazed at how consistent and alike the discussions were. Each group narrowed 12 value statements to 5. The 5 core value statements identified by each group were the same. The groups then combined for a summary discussion and added an additional 6th value statement. It was pointed out that this was a "work in progress" and would continue to be a topic at future Council meetings.

At 8:15 PM, the Council convened for our regular August Council meeting. VBS Safe Haven incidents were reviewed. The Council approved the June 20th Minutes with one correction. The minutes have been posted on the Council Bulletin Board in the Fellowship Hall.

Karen Young then presented the June/July Financial Reports, focusing on July, since it contained year to date figures. We are ahead of last year's income through July by \$27,046, after backing our Special Giving income of \$12,165. Pledged giving is equal with last year, while the Building Usage Fees are considerably more in 2017 than in past years. The full financial report has been posted in the Fellowship Hall for more in-depth information.

Irene Bizier then went over the 2018 budget development process. Each Council Liaison was asked to contact their ministry leaders to get updated information on budget needs for 2018. Budget information is to be provided to Karen and Irene by October 6th. The Council will then review a preliminary 2018 budget draft at the October 17 Council Meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 PM with the Lord's prayer. In Christ's Service,
