### Confirming Our Faith

What a glorious morning! Can there be a more grand celebration than Confirmation Sunday? And to connect it to Pentecost only adds to the drama and to the hope. The power of the Spirit and the potential of the Church wrapped up in the experience of these young people who spent some time considering their role in the Body of Christ. Enjoy the morning, I know I will.

We tend to think that this is their day. Those Confirmands have prepared for this day, studied and discussed and learned together. Now they stand up and say yes in a public way in front of the whole congregation. It is their day. Congratulate them, welcome them.

But it isn't just their day. It is our day too. The church's day. We ask the confirmands to make a commitment to the Church. To this church. And now it is our turn. We need to make a commitment to them. To say that we will make room for them. That we will acknowledge that because of them, we are now different. They complete us, for now. They redefine us.

But we want this to be a corporate experience. We want you to have a say, to help us determine a new direction and new hope. We are looking to launch a forum on Worship in the very near future. We want to hear from as many voices as possible. We want to stay true to who we are and yet reach out to include others, some like the ones who stand in front of the church today.

Watch for details and when and where such a forum will take place. And try your best to come and be a part of the conversation. In the meantime, pray for wisdom, for leaders and followers. Pray that we can begin to listen to the Spirit who calls us to worship in ways that include and encourage, who calls us to move further down the path of hospitality and invitation. Pray for discernment and the courage to follow the winds of the Spirit. There just may be a new and exciting land in front of us. Let's go.

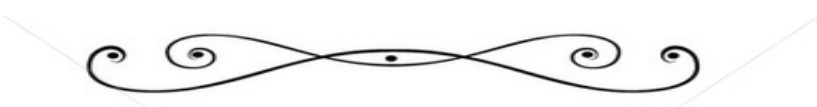
