SPRC Spotlight on Jeffrey Manns

This month's spotlight is on Jeffrey who is Director of Music Ministry. His wife, Rebecca, leads the Audio/Visual Ministry at Aldersgate, and together they have two daughters, Savannah (12) and Gabriella (9). All are very active at Aldersgate.

Jeffrey claims "his real musical passion is in the choral arts" and is currently a member of several ensembles including **The Tucson Chamber Artists** (Tucson, AZ), **Vox Humana** (Dallas, TX), **Spire** (Kansas City, MO), **The Crossing** (Philadelphia, PA), **The Thirteen** (Princeton, NJ), **The Princeton Singers** (Princeton, NJ), and local ensembles **CoroAllegro**, **Quinctus**, and **The Mastersingers of Wilmington**. Jeffrey also performed for six summer seasons with the **Santa Fe Desert Chorale** in New Mexico.

In July, Jeff sang with **Vox Humana** at the Texas Choral Directors Convention in San Antonio, followed by two performances in Waco and Dallas. The concerts were to promote the ensemble's recently released CD *Into the Night*, available on iTunes or at

Barnes and Noble. Upcoming performances for Jeffrey include appearances with **The Crossing** at The Crane Center for the Arts in Philadelphia and the **Metropolitan Museum of Art and Carnegie Hall** in New York City; **Spire**, in performances of the *Rank Martin Mass for Double Choir* at the Kauffman Center of the Performing Arts; **The Princeton Singers**, in a Composers forum on the campus of Lehigh University; and **Vox Humana**, in performances at the Meyerson Symphony Center and on the campus of Southern Methodist University. Locally, Jeffrey will appear in performances with **CoroAllegro**, **The Mastersingers of Wilmington**, and **Quinctus**.

Jeffrey currently serves as Assistant Director of **CoroAllegro**, Wilmington's select vocal chamber ensemble and is also Assistant Director and co-founder of **Quinctus**, a new 5-member men's ensemble based in Newark, DE.

In August, Jeffrey presented two sessions on Music and Worship at the American Choral Directors "Voices United" Conference at George Mason University in Fairfax, VA. During the convention, he was selected by his peers as the Music and Worship Repertoire and Standards Chairperson for the State of Delaware. As part of this election, Jeffrey will participate in board meetings and events, as well as help plan, program, and serve regional and national conventions.

At Aldersgate, Jeffrey conducts the Chancel Choir, Gateway Ringers, and Journey Band weekly, as well as coordinating and conducting the Aldersgate Brass, the Aldersgate Men's Ensemble, The Arts @ Aldersgate Music Series, and works with the musicians who provide music each Sunday for worship. Along with his musical duties, Jeffrey also assists Pastor Chris and Pastor Don with worship planning for the traditional services and the Journey.

Jeff is excited for the year ahead. His plan for Christmas is a combined concert with all ensembles of the Music Ministry presenting *A Feast of Carols* by Randall Bass.

With an eye to getting as many as possible involved, Jeffrey says, "Whether you are a professional musician, or a music lover, we have a place for you at Aldersgate!"

The SPRC (Staff-Parish Relations Committee) is the administrative unit in a local church where staff and congregational interests are integrated to focus on the mission of the church. The committee relates to all staff, both bishop-appointed staff and employed staff. While August itself set us back, year-to-date we are in a positive position through what is historically the most challenging season of the year. Here is a look at the past 6 months...



September Update

We have begun to meet again after a restful summer and note that there are now a number of issues to work on, some of which are carryovers from the earlier part of the year and others which have now presented themselves.

Security: Our primary focus this fall will be instituting a new security system for building access. We have secured three bids from local companies and will select a vendor and all hardware with a redesigned procedure in October. It looks as if the best fit for Aldersgate will be an entirely new outside door entry system, still making use of the keys we use for all areas inside the building. We are wrestling with how to secure the building and its various doors while making sure doors are closed and locked when they are not being used or are unattended. The next edition of the Messenger will have a complete explanation of our new hardware and procedures for entering, leaving and securing the building. Insofar as possible, we will change only that which is absolutely necessary to increase safety in the use of the church.

Building Maintenance: The building presents a number of other challenges, which are rapidly becoming needs, as opposed to wants, and which need to be scheduled. If you've looked at the outside of the building at the roof line, particularly above the glass doors, you will note that we are in need of painting or resurfacing the areas just below the roof. Our initial thought has been given to how we might best do this and when. Options and pricing are being assembled.

Heating /Air Conditioning: We also have three *rapidly aging* central air conditioning units. Parts are no longer available for the one unit that has a deteriorating drip pan (large cookie sheet type of metal tray that catches the water that is produced when air is conditioned and funnels the water into our drain system). We are looking into whether or not a pan can be fabricated to allow us an extra year or two from this unit, or if it is wiser to simply replace the entire unit now. Some energy cost savings would be realized with a newer unit. In checking on this unit, we realize that the other two we use are nearly as old. Needs-planning will require that we look at replacement of these units within the next couple of years at a cost of \$10,000 per unit.

Our Parsonage: Work continues at our Oakwood Parsonage. The lawn is being brought back to better condition and a dead tree was removed from the front yard. Gutter cleaning has been accomplished, as has some general clean up of the grounds. Further lawn fertilization is planned for the near future. In the coming year we will look into re-siding the house which has been deferred from prior years along with repairing some of the outstanding issues in the interior.

New Dogwood: You may have noticed that in the place of the large and decaying Maple tree, we have a beautiful young Dogwood. This was a Memorial gift to the church. Unfortunately, it is in a heavily trafficked area and needs further tender loving care in order to have a good start in the flower bed area near the glass doors. As always, the grounds group would love to have help in weeding, mulching and in pruning several of our bushes and trees. If you have an interest, watch for our notices as to work days and join us.

Labyrinth Benches: The next time you visit the Labyrinth, note that the memorial plaques have been placed on the benches. We would like to add other benches to that area in the coming years. They make a great and lasting memorial for loved ones that were once a part of Aldersgate.

The Budget: Thus far in 2013 we have spent a great deal less than the budgeted amount allocated for Trustees. This is likely to change in the last few months of the year, although we remain very cognizant of proper stewardship guidelines. With a healthier financial position, we will plan on a larger budget for maintenance and building improvement issues in the coming year, with extended planning for replacement of certain critical portions of the building (roofs, heating and air-conditioning plants, and doors for example) in the coming years.

The Trustees next meeting will be Tuesday, October 1. If you have any business that you feel the trustees should address, concerns about the buildings and grounds or otherwise, please feel free to contact any one of us and we'll make sure they are addressed.

The trustees are: Bob Reis, Dave Dunbar, Carolyn Fleckenstein, Jane Smith, Jay Doughty, Doug DeVoll, Don Moore, Rick Cross and Joanne Smeltz. Royal Lowthert is the staff ex officio member.
