"Quiet, Be Still"

The Sea of Galilee was a favorite location for Jesus. The Sea is mentioned more than forty times in the Gospels. We find Jesus walking along the lakeshore. We find Jesus getting in and out of boats. We even find Jesus

walking on top of the Sea. I remember fondly taking a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. I pictured in my mind Jesus doing the same thing. We sailed out of the port of Tiberias and headed north and east. Amazingly, in the past two thousand years, there has been little development on the lakeshore. When you sail across and look at land, you see similar views that Jesus and his disciples would have had. Some of the great stories in Jesus' ministry took place at the Sea of Galilee.

The lake is seven to eight miles across and thirteen miles long. It is called by four names in the Bible and even today depending on the location you live around the lake: Lake Kinneret (possibly from *kinnor*, the Hebrew word for harp since the lake is shaped like a harp), Lake Gennesaret, Lake Tiberias, or the Sea of Galilee. It is located seven hundred feet below sea level so it is the lowest freshwater lake in the world. Its average depth is eighty-four feet, but at one place it is one hundred and fifty feet deep.

One of my favorite stories on this lake is found in Mark 4 and repeated in Matthew 8 and Luke 8. In Matthew's account, we learn that Jesus had been in Capernaum all day with his disciples healing the sick, casting out demons, and preaching. It was now evening and he was exhausted. He said to his disciples, "Let's get into the boat and go to the other side of the lake."

The boat they climbed in was a small fishing boat, estimated to be about twenty-seven feet long. It would hold twelve people. So they get into the boat for what would have been about a two-hour journey. Jesus heads to the back of the boat to lie down on a cushion where he quickly goes to sleep. After a bit, a furious storm comes up. The word used for this type of storm is *seismos*. It is translated as "tempest" or "earthquake." The wind was blowing like crazy and rain was pouring down. Waves were breaking over the small boat until it was "nearly swamped" as Mark says.

So here they are in the middle of a storm in deep water several miles from shore. Mark records what happens next: "The disciples woke him and said to him, 'Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" (4:38). Can't you picture Jesus waking up and basically saying: "Don't you guys get it yet? Were you not with me when I cast out demons and healed the sick? Remember when I turned the water to wine? Do you really think this boat is going to sink while I'm asleep?

Mark says, "He rebuked the wind and said to the waves, 'Quiet, be still.' And the wind died down and it was completely calm" (4:39).

Jesus shows that he has complete power over the forces of nature in that moment. Jesus can control the wind and the rain. This scene takes us back to Moses when he parted the Red Sea. The disciples realize once again that they were not dealing with an ordinary man. This
