Develop relationships by spending time with others outside of regular meetings. Take initiative by inviting someone over for coffee or by going out to lunch after a Sunday gathering.



How should Christians engage the arts?



The book of Galatians is one of Paul's most impassioned and eloquent letters.




Let my people go...
