



CHILDREN: For protection from disease, trauma, and harm. Pray they would have a vision for the future of their country and hearts open to Jesus.



Teacher Training

Children in the BESTWA feeding program attend 17 different schools in Buchanan. We recently formed an advisory council to partner with the principals and teachers of those schools to guarantee an excellent education is provided the children.

Goal: Take a consultant to Liberia to assess where we can have the most impact.

Dennis Birthing Clinic

When completed, the Dennis Birthing Clinic will provide prenatal care, birth services, and facilitate the training of local midwives. Windows, interior finish, flooring, solar power, and water (drilled well, pumps, water tower, filtration system) are needed to open the clinic.
