"Hide n' Seek"

"Hide n' Seek." We have all played it: Someone hides and someone else tries to find them. I believe that many people think having a relationship with God is like playing "Hide n' Seek." God to them is someone who shrouds Himself in mystery and holds Himself aloof from us. They would say only those who are prepared to undertake an arduous search for God will find Him.

I think the very opposite is true. The Bible represents God as One who seeks and searches for us. Look at the story of Jesus' healing of the blind man in John 9. Once, while preparing to preach on this passage, my attention was drawn to verse 35 of this chapter. Just prior to this verse the healed man has been thrown out of his synagogue because he exalted Jesus for doing such a marvelous thing for him. Understand, please, that to be put out of one's synagogue was a very serious matter. A person in this state was not only excluded from the community's religious life, but also from its social and economic activities as well. Anyone thrown out of the synagogue was indeed in dire straits.

Look at what happens next in the story. Verse 35 reads: "Jesus heard that they had put him out; and finding him, He said, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?'" Note those underlined words. Mark them well~ "and finding him." Who looked for whom when this man was in trouble? It was Jesus who searched for this man, found him, and then brought him into relationship with Himself.

If there is any hiding in terms of our relationship with God, friends, it is we who are doing it. All it takes to find the Savior is to stop running, turn around, and look into the eyes of One who is hot on our heels. May all of us seek after God with the same passion God displays as He seeks after us.

Since the next Session meeting won't be until after you receive this Bethany Road, I have decided to do a brief summary of the activities of the recent congregational meeting for those who were not able to attend.

The meetings followed a delicious dinner served by the Deacons. We did have a quorum present—a quorum is 10% of the active roll of Bethany. Since the active roll is currently 499 we had to have 50 people in atten-

dance.

The following were elected to serve three-year terms as Elders: Steve Amsler, John Inman, Dan Lawyer, Gary McElfresh, and Linda Munnell. Those elected to the office of Deacon for three year terms were: Deb Bayer, Kathleen Daley, Jennie Hunter, Ken Knechtel, Jack Miller, and Rita Thompson. Dave Ruhlman was elected to serve a two-year term.

It was noted that Bethany Church

finished 2009 with a net income of \$2,491.81 and a balanced budget was approved by Session for 2010.

Rev. Leuenberger and Mrs. Allen presented reports, which can be found along with more details of the life of Bethany Church in 2009 in the annual report, which can be secured from Lois in the Church Office.

No doubt about it - our lives are busy! Even in our busiest of times, most of us want to draw near to God and renew our relationship with Him.

We are going to offer you a way to begin the Lenten Season with an opportunity to slow down for a few minutes and draw close to God. We are going to offer communion on Ash Wednesday, February 17 at three different times during the day, with each time slot lasting about 15 minutes. You can stop by the church on your way to work at 6:15 am, during lunch-time hour at 12:15 pm, or on your way home after a busy day at 5:15 pm. We hope you will take this opportunity to stop "the rushing" for a few minutes, reset the focus button of your heart and begin the Lenten Season with renewed hope and thanksgiving for all Christ has done in your life.

Not only do we want you to be aware of God in your everyday lives, we also want to offer you a way to be an effective and caring witness to those around you by praying for others to be aware of God in their lives.

In knowing what prayer has meant to us and knowing that Jesus wants us to pray for all people, we are asking you to pick five neighbors to pray for during Lent. Who are neighbors? As Jesus said, they are people you pass on your journey. They could be family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, or even the difficult people in your life. We will have a little pamphlet available that will easily explain how to pray for five people, for five minutes, for five blessings, for five weeks during Lent. We also have Easter cards available for you to send as a way to let people know you care and that God loves them.

It's my hope and prayer for each of you to have a meaningful Lenten Season, both in what you receive and in what you give to others.

Military Prayer

Prayer Focus – the Surge in Afghanistan

Currently about 70,000 U.S. troops are in Afghanistan. The surge will bring that number to around 100,000 service members. The conditions in this country are made difficult by the high altitudes and remote mountainous terrain. Our soldiers also face the elements of harsh weather – from about June to September there is a “wind of 120 days” when the country’s western and southern regions experience high clouds of dust and heat. The goal of our troops’ efforts in Afghanistan is to protect the Afghan people against the Taliban-led insurgents who are seeking to establish a Sunni state under their leader, Mullah Omar.

Army Gen. Stanley A. McChrystal is commanding our soldiers in Afghanistan and states that another goal is “improving citizens’ quality of life through reconstruction and infrastructure projects...and reducing Afghan civilian casualties during anti-insurgent operations.” Unfortunately, Gen. McChrystal also noted in a report in December that the insurgency is gaining strength and attacks are on the rise.

Your prayers are needed to give our soldiers protection especially from roadside bombs as they conduct patrols and for safety of the helicopter pilots who face the danger of bad weather and rocket attacks as they seek to deliver food, medical supplies and mail to our soldiers in the outlying bases.

Adam Lott currently serves in southern Afghanistan with the 82nd Airborne, and

Blake Kosmowski and **Jay Kelso** are scheduled to deploy there later this year.

This note to the Congregation was received from **Bill Fusz**, who is based at Camp Ramadi, Iraq: “Thank you so much for thinking of me and my paratroopers during this Christmas season, particularly in your cards, thoughts and prayers. It is immensely comforting to know that as we go about our duties here in western Iraq this deployment, we are being lifted up in prayer by all of you in Mercer. I hope that you have had a blessed Christmas and look forward to seeing you and thanking you in person this New Year when I return from deployment.”
