through the prayers of Scripture and the disciplines of faith."

The first is the book, "Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life" by Donald Whitney. This book is a great introductory book discussing the purpose of Spiritual Disciplines and then spending a chapter each looking at ten specific spiritual disciplines. It balances well explaining the disciplines and giving specific helpful suggestions in how to actually engage in each of the dis-

ciplines that are looked at. The ten disciplines that are discussed in this book are: Bible, Prayer, Worship, Evangelism, Serving, Stewardship, Fasting, Silence and Solitude, Journaling, and Learning. This book will be useful, and encouraging to the person who has been following Jesus for most of their life, as well to the person who is just beginning in their relationship with Jesus.

The second book is, "Prayer: Experiencing Awe

and Intimacy with God" by Tim Keller. The reason for recommending this book is the thorough why in which Keller looks at prayer. Books on prayer typically tend to find themselves very strong in one of two areas. Some books on prayer are strong theologically. They do a good job of explaining prayer from a Biblical and theological perspective. Other books on prayer are good practically. They give lots of practical suggestions on how to actually pray. The reason I am recommending this book is

because it does both well.
I trust that you will enjoy, benefit, and grow in your knowledge and practice of prayer as a result of this book.

Missions Focus - David & Beth Roberts

The Roberts serve in addictions recovery ministry and church planting. Argentina is a country of 43 million and recently identified by the United Nations as a major destination for drug trafficking. David collaborates with a rehab center for young men. The Roberts family is also working on a grassroots church planting movement outreach the unchurched in their city. Only 3.7% of the population identify as evangelical in their religion.

One of the realities of their work is relapse. A lot of time and resources are invested in individual lives in the hope that they will never fall back into their old ways. While they make tremendous changes and exhibit much hope, many relapse causing much disappointment. While this is discouraging and can question the work being done, it reminds us to keep perspective.

The Roberts remind us that relapse does not mean the person is a lost cause. It can remind people that they aren't fully recovered and still need help. Last, remember that if



God has begun a good work, he will bring it to completion.
