
WEATHER ALERT Winter weather will be here

WHAT IS VIBRANT FAITH AT BETHLEHEM?

Bethlehem's model of Vibrant Faith is a paradigm in which we strive to connect faith in a meaningful way to our daily lives at home and away from home. Along with using Taking Faith Home bulletin inserts in worship, meetings, and personally, we try to emphasize the beautiful connection of using them as a devotional and worship tool in the home with family and friends. The 4 Key Faith Practices; Caring Conversations, Devotions, Service, and Rituals & Devotions, teaches people how to connect our congregational worship experience with daily practices to nurture faith away from our Sunday morning experience. Our hope in modeling the 4 Key format in programming, like our Hanging of the Greens Cross-generational Event the beginning of December or the Pre-Advent Advent Workshop in November, is that it will encourage members to deepen their faith experience and recognize opportunities to celebrate God's presence in everyday moments.

Bethlehem's Milestones and Blessings Ministry also is a part of our Apostle's Creed pew cards, and Vibrant Faith paradigm which seeks to celebrate special milestones and moments that recur in our lives. We try to recognize opportunities for the youngest member to the oldest, recognizing that many of our traditional faith milestones happen amidst the earliest years of life. Several of the milestones and blessings Bethlehem celebrates occur annually, while others occasionally. For many of them we include resources for continuing the celebration at home and give a memento as a symbol of the sacred and holy moment celebrated. Often the resources include 4 Key Faith Practices to equip and nurture faith in the home, allowing people to experience faith in daily life occasions.

Bethlehem's Vibrant Faith culture also offers resources like the Taking Faith Home bulletin inserts, devotions, children's seasonal activity packets, Taking Faith Home Cards, The Word in Season booklets, social media (Facebook,

#blcsharing), Lord's Prayer and others. The beauty in offering a variety of resources is that we are invited into the holy places of God's work in and among us, like when we hear the children during worship reading the Apostle's Creed from the pew card, or see Megan's prayer journal from her weekly Taking Faith Home insert devotional practice, or find Lisa on her horse with the #blcsharing picture card. Hearing children during worship reading aloud the Apostle's Creed gives us hope. Seeing Megan's prayer journal inspires us. Finding Lisa's picture with #blcsharing encourages us. We grow in faith when we are nurtured by the power of the Holy Spirit in worship, programming, prayer, and community with one another. Then we are sent, with blessing, into our homes and the world, to share our faith vibrantly.

God be with you as you grow in faith and share faith vibrantly.
