### A BRIGE TO TRANSITION

Last month, I had the opportunity to spend some time in nature. I came across this bridge. For me, this bridge was a wonderful reminder that through any change in life, we cross over into a new beginning. While we cannot see what ventures lie ahead, we can cross over that bridge with trust,

knowing and believing God's hand leads us with grace, hope, love, and promise.

On **November 3**, **All Saints Day**, we have an opportunity to remember and celebrate the saints who have died this past year. The saints we remember have gifted us with memories and taught us something about life and faith. We hold on to the promises of a resurrected Christ who remind us that nothing can separate us from the love of God.

On that same day, we celebrate **40 years** since Bethlehem's church and education building was dedicated. Think of all the "bridges" of change this congregation encountered over the years: changes of pastors and staff, additions and remodels inside and outside of our worship and education space, ministries added, worship and life milestone celebrations that touch life from birth to death. At every "bridge" of change, God was there.

November 3 will be my last day with you as your interim pastor. Thank for the opportunity to be with you as you prepare to call your next pastor. My heart has been touched by so many of you who have welcomed me, trusted me as your pastor, and accepted my leadership. I ask for your forgiveness where there has been mistakes and misunderstanding. Please know I forgive where there has been hurt. My sister's illness has reminded me again that life is too short to hold on to places of hurt without forgiveness.



What happens for me after Bethlehem? I cross a "bridge" of unknowns. I have put on hold any employment opportunities and will move into "retired" status with the ELCA to protect my healthcare benefits. I believe God has something amazing planned for me. During November I will spend some time in the mountains at Holden Village in Washington state and take time to be with my sister who begins a new trial study at Ohio State for her cancer.

As we all cross over into on a new chapter in life as faithful disciples of Jesus, I share with you **Psalm 51** which was used a few weeks ago at worship. May these words remind us of the importance of walking this bridge in life as members of God's Church, united as one body in Christ.

Create in us a clean heart,
O God,
and put a new and right
spirit within us.
Do not cast us away from
your presence,
and do not take
your holy spirit from us.
Restore to us the
joy of your salvation,
and sustain in us
a willing spirit.

Thank you again for the opportunity to be with you this past year. May God continue to bless you as you walk as faithful disciples of Jesus.



### WHAT CHURCHES NEED TO DO TO THRIVE IN THE 21st CENTURY

Last summer, Luther Seminary hosted a "Faithful Innovation Summit." They identify seven key themes that churches and their leaders need to address in order to thrive in the 21st century.

**Deepened Christian Identity & Practice**—In a culture in which Christian faith is no longer assumed, congregations need a Christ-centered identity, embodied in a life of discipleship and nourished by spiritual practice. People are looking for a deep connection with God and neighbor.

**Cultivate Community** Congregations must learn how to meet people where they are and enter into intentional practices of mutual listening, relationship-building and reconciliation.

**Innovate Faithfully—**Congregations need a vibrant spiritual and theological purpose that frees them to experiment.

**Improve Administrative Leadership**—Leaders need to be trained in organizational leadership, management and administration for a 21st century world.

**Shift Ministry Models—**As church participation declines, churches are experimenting with new models and sources of income, including entrepreneurial ways of financing ministry.

**Equipping the Saints**—Effective congregations focus on multiplying lay leaders, not for committee work, but for front-line ministry in the church and the world.

**Connect with Diverse Neighbors—10 a.m** on **Sunday** is still among the most segregated times of the week. Congregations need a commitment to intercultural competency of mutual welcome.

Lord, we give you thanks for the freedom




### MANNA AND MERCY




November 3, as we remember all the saints who have died this past year. Cill Saints Day This year we will be remembering the


### **GIVING WITHOUT A CHECK**
