From the Associational Mission Strategist

In light of the recent report of over 700 victims of sexual abuse in Southern Baptist Churches over the last 20 years, I want to encourage our churches to do everything in their power to protect both current and potential abuse victims. While sexual abuse against a person of any age is a crime, most sexual abuse in local churches happens to children and youth. With that in mind, consider adopting the following protective standards:

- Hire/choose your youth and children's workers very carefully. If applicable, contact their former place of service and ask about their track record.
- Perform background checks on all youth and children's workers. (We can help.)
- Closely screen any camp or ministry with whom youth stay overnight. (The child protection ministry MinistrySafe does not recommend overnight events for elementary children.)
- Treat every potential victim as if he or she was your child.
- Do not protect abusers, no matter who they are or how long they've been there.
- When abuse is confirmed, call the police. Sexual abuse is a crime.
- Do not bring shame to Jesus and His Church by not handling these issues.

Although we may be tempted to sweep sexual abuse reports under the rug as exaggerated, not that big of a deal, or just too messy, we must focus on the victim instead of the church's comfort or reputation. While we believe in extending grace, we are not doing so if we enable sexual predators. Our apathy and/or insufficient action allows them to scar and potentially destroy countless lives, including their own. If you know you need to act but don't know where to start, call me. I'll be glad to walk through the process with you.

Also, our SBC president, J. D. Greear, recently launched the "Who's Your One?" evangelism strategy, for which your church should receive an information packet in the near future. Simply stated, each church member is being asked to identify one person with whom they will share the gospel in 2019. Just imagine, if every member of your church led one person to Christ, your church would double in size! If you haven't already identified your "One," begin asking God to reveal that person to you. Remember, if you know enough to be a Christian, you know enough to lead someone else to faith in Christ.


