## **POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES**

Leadership & Management

- Develop, maintain, and support a strong board: serve as ex-officio of each committee, seek and build board involvement with organizational strategic direction
- Manage and ensure strong working relationship with the Emmanuel Gospel Center, BFJN's legal and fiscal sponsor.

## Fundraising & Communications

- Expand fundraising base to cover 50% of organizational budget through monthly individual giving
- Continue to develop funding relationships with churches and private foundations
- Deepen and refine all aspects of communications with the goal of creating a stronger brand identity for economic discipleship
