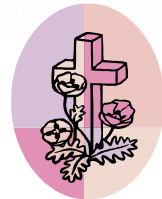

BEFRIENDER TRAINING 2013

The Pastoral Care Department at Trinity Regional Medical Center in Rock Island is delighted to offer BeFriender Training once again beginning in March.

BeFrienders Defined: A BeFriender is a volunteer who is a trained and oriented member of our community. This caregiver is gifted and mature. The BeFriender visits patients within the hospital or their faith congregation.

BeFriender Training is a 10-week course.

Preliminary Interview is required: A member of the chaplaincy staff will interview each prospective student to determine compatibility with the program. This is done soon after a person registers for the course.

Subjects covered such as: Developing listening skills; understanding grief; the role of the BeFriender; understanding ecumenism, confidentiality, and boundaries; becoming familiar with hospital rules and policies.

BeFrienders are: Mature, gifted and motivated students who wish to do ministry of visitation for their congregation or the community.

Commitment to learning: We will utilize chaplains, nurses, social work people and medical staff to teach the ten week course. It is expected that each student will attend all the classes.

Cost: (includes notebooks, teaching and handouts)

Free for those willing to give one year of service to Trinity Medical Center after finishing the training.

\$75 for an individual without other obligations to the hospital.

\$150 per five students from any one congregation without obligations to Trinity Medical Center.

Saving CeeCee Honeycutt by Beth Hoffman

When Camille Sugarbaker Honeycutt, the pretty but crazy 1951 Vidalia Onion Queen, dies suddenly, her twelve-year-old daughter CeeCee has barely a hope left in the world. To her rescue arrives Great Aunt Tootie in the most magnificent car CeeCee has ever seen, and she is whisked away to the storybook city of Savannah. For some flowers, Aunt Tootie holds, are born to bloom only south of the Mason-Dixon line and soon, among the sweet scent of magnolias and the loving warmth of Tootie and her colorful collection of friends, it looks as though CeeCee has arrived in paradise. But when a darker side to the Southern dream threatens this delicate, newfound happiness, Aunt Tootie and her friends must rally to CeeCee’s aid. Warm yet heartbreaking, and generously spiced with humor, Saving CeeCee Honeycutt is the story of a girl who loses her mother but finds many others under a balmy Georgia sun.
