



Bushfire saw another great miracle crusade in Uganda, Africa in August 2008.

Team member Peter Gray kindly compiled the following report:

The stage is erected at one end of Kisaasi Primary School playing field, with huge PA speakers at each end booming out the message to the crowd, the houses beyond, and the hill beyond them.

Sitting at the back of the stage on the plastic chairs thoughtfully provided by local churches, we have a good view of the crowd and area beyond.

As usual in Uganda, the crowd consists of lots of wide-eyed children at the front, women standing behind them, and the men hovering at the back.



"If there are any witch doctors out there, I say this: show me your power; and I'll show you mine. No weapon formed against me shall prosper!"

Andy proclaimed on the first night. OK, we thought, this could be interesting....

Although no witchdoctor showed themselves this year, we saw plenty of evidence of their work in the prayer lines: many, many people being set free from nightmares, demonic oppression and fears as well as various illnesses. But most striking was the number of babies suffering from cerebral palsy – four or five on the first two nights. Team member Ian, an experienced doctor, had never seen so many in one place at one time before. We realised that this was symptomatic of the witchcraft in the area, and that rather than treating them as individual cases, we needed to pray for a breakthrough in the Heavenly realms over that area. And the breakthrough came on the Friday.

As we watched and prayed on the stage, a heavenly host advanced in the sky from over the hill opposite where we were, and gradually formed a large circle over us. The Lord of Hosts had moved on behalf of the people of Kisaasi, and the area will never be the same again. That evening and the following evening we saw three of the babies showing clear signs of healing: one of them stood up for the first time ever, and another could follow movements with its eyes: a miraculous breakthrough for a child that previously showed no sign of awareness of the outside world.

Although the majority of the crowds were believers from local churches, when the altar call for those wanting to be saved went forth, the numbers responding were surprisingly high – about 90 on this first evening, rising to nigh on 200 on both Friday and Saturday and a further 200 on the Sunday, bringing the total to approx 800. Praise God!
