So how did those Advent and Christmas interruptions go? I was blessed by those who did share the stories of 'interruptions' that found them, often in the form of people or nature. Now, in January, in the season of Epiphany, we get to let the Light find us, so that we can receive it and reflect it to others.

Light can take a variety of forms. A form that I have found and named recently is W.I.T.H. = **W**hat **I T**oday **H**eard. Often a word, a name or a theme repeatedly shows up in a day or within a week or even a season. If I tune my ears and eyes to it, then I can tune my heart and spirit toward what God seems to be calling to my attention. Naming W.I.T.H. serves to remind me that God was, is and will always be **with** us. Jesus, Emmanuel, "I will be with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20 Like a wink or gentle embrace from God. How have you been seeing God W.I.T.H. you?

When we can more readily and expectantly seek this W.I.T.H., I believe we can find and shine the Light more quickly when the world keeps reminding us of the seemingly ever present darkness. for Justice & Peace In All The Earth

And what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:8b NRSV)

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. (Matthew 5:9 NRSV)

"Along with all citizens, Christians and others have the responsibility to defend human rights and to work for freedom, justice, peace, environmental well being and good order." (ELCA Social Statement, The Church in Society: A Lutheran Perspective, 1991, page 5).

We celebrate the abundant blessings that are a part of this world. But we also walk in the struggle of human existence where we face our own sin, our self -centeredness, and the collective sin of human institutions, for example, the church, governments, the nations. filled with peace is faith in practice. Practicing our faith is something that we may never master. We always have more to learn. The focus of our practice is our gracious God, not the practices in themselves. Our faith practices are always an offering of response to our gracious God. May God work on you as you practice your faith in the midst of life in God's church and God's world.

- Host an after-school, summer or weekend feeding program for children and families
- Begin a "Go Green" Initiative in your congregation & community lutheransrestoringcreation.org
- ♦ Forgive as we have been forgiven by God
- Organize a community march against family violence
- ♦ Challenge the systems that perpetuate poverty
- Contact the ELCA Advocacy Office about joining with other Lutherans to speak to public officials about the difference your congregational ministries make in your community

- Love all of humanity, respecting everyone, and seeing differences as a gift from God

Beyond New Year's Resolutions Take Off Pounds Sensibly | TOPS

"For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord, "plans to prosper you, and not to harm you, plans to give you a future and a hope...In that day you will call to me, and I will listen. You will find me when you look for me with all of your heart." Jeremiah 29:11

No matter where you are on the spiritual growth pathway, it is likely that God is calling you to grow in some area of your life during 2018. This could include spiritual health, emotional health, physical health, and likely a combination of all three. Change is necessary when you realize that some aspect of your life or lifestyle is not working for you, or could work better. God often makes us aware of needed changes through other people, circumstances or His Word, the Bible. Most often, significant healthy changes will involve attitude, behavior and lifestyle.

When we recently looked at a "step chart" during GIFT Sunday preparation, it occurred to me that another step chart could apply to all of us - the BMI (Body Mass Index) chart. Your doctor may reference this chart when discussing your height and weight ratio. If the very thought of a BMI chart or stepping on the scales at your doctor's office strikes terror in your hear. Or if you have considered the possibility of making healthy changes in your own lifestyle, but aren't sure where to start. Or if you have tried to manage your weight in the past with only the "boomerang" result (losing weight, gaining it all back or gaining even more), I have good news for you! You're not alone, you're not terrible and you're not hopeless.

This year, consistent with Calvary's Better Together approach, we are continuing a no-nonsense, user friendly, low-cost, measurable outcome based weight management program called TOPS - Take Off Pounds Sensibly. TOPS is a nation-wide weight loss support program that does not pay for celebrity endorsements or force you to buy special food. Weekly meetings include private weigh-ins and professionally developed, up-to-date information on nutrition, exercise and healthy lifestyle formation. Group discussion focuses on reinforcing sound healthy lifestyle principles, encouragement with accountability, friendship, incentives, and a "faith friendly" atmosphere.

Similar to Alcoholics Anonymous and Celebrate

Recovery, we will admit that (in our own strength) we are powerless over temptation, focus on small but significant steps toward a healthier lifestyle and affirm one another each week with this TOPS pledge: "I am an intelligent person. I will control my emotions and not let my emotions control me. Every time I am tempted to use food to satisfy my frustrated desires, build up my injured ego or dull my senses, I will remember: even though I may overeat in private, my unhealthy weight is stealing away my quality of life every day. I will Take Off Pounds Sensibly, and I ask God to help and guide me."

Calvary's TOPS group is for men and women, meets at White Lake Wednesdays from 12:15-1:30pm. And there's always an empty chair waiting for you to join us!
