 - B. The man (not mentioned) caught in adultery.
 - C. The teachers of the law and Pharisees.
 - D. Jesus
5. Read Leviticus 20:10 and Deuteronomy 22:22. What does the Old Testament say about the laws regarding adultery in the Old Testament?
6. How does our culture view adultery?
7. In this series, we have said that Jesus exhibited grace and truth. How do you see him exhibiting both in this story?
8. When we think about sin, what is man's perspective? What is God's perspective? Read Romans 3:23 and 6:23.
9. Think about your answers to questions 1 and 2. What would it mean to offer grace to the worst person and the worst sin that came to your mind?
10. How has grace changed you?
11. What does the statement "Now that you have been graced...go live it" mean to you?
