Pressing Forward

Nathan is starting his training in law enforcement this month and we are interviewing candidates to fill his position. The leadership team reviewed the applications received and narrowed down the list of candidates based on education, experience and aptitude as seen in their resume. We have interviewed two of the candidates by phone and will be interviewing two more very soon. We are looking for someone who can oversee the program from the nursery through high school. We have many dedicated members who have worked with the children's ministry who we know will support the new youth and children's minister in his duties. We know that when families visit the church if there are not programs that teach and excite their children for God, they don't come back. We pray that we will find a young man who has a passion for leading kids to Christ and who can relate to children and their parents. This is one of the ways we will grow Capital City Christian Church.

Our average giving for June has been less than \$4,000. From January through May our average giving was \$6,600, and that was not meeting our budget needs. We obviously have to adjust our budget. The leadership team will be meeting soon to discuss where we can cut our expenses and still maintain the programs we need to keep an active, growing Church. You can do your part through your consistent faithful giving. Thank you to all of those who have been faithful as we adjust to the changes at Capital City.

Our Seniors Ministry recently took a group to see the Peach State Summer Theatre production of The Sound of Music. I heard wonderful things about the trip from those who went. This group is an example of a small group where we can fellowship together and learn more about each other. In 1 Peter 4 he says "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins." Love is shown in small fellowship groups such as the Seniors Ministry, Ladies Ministry, Life Groups, Sunday School, and Youth Groups. Here we can show the love of Christ and share our burdens. These are the places you grow and learn about each other. Peter goes on to say, "If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ." Serving in these small groups God is praised. 1 Peter 4:10, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."
