## When Mistakes and Miracles Collide

### It started with a vision from God ... but nothing happened for years!

Genesis 12:1-3 Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: <sup>2</sup> And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: <sup>3</sup> And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

#### Abram must have been tired of taking second best while waiting ...

**Genesis 13:8-9** And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdmen and thy herdmen; for we *be* brethren. <sup>9</sup> Is not the whole land before thee? separate thyself, I pray thee, from me: if *thou wilt take* the left hand, then I will go to the right; or if *thou depart* to the right hand, then I will go to the left.

#### Abram argued with the Lord about the vision ... but still believed ...

Genesis 15:2-6 And Abram said, Lord GOD, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house *is* this Eliezer of Damascus? <sup>3</sup> And Abram said, Behold, to me thou hast given no seed: and, lo, one born in my house is mine heir. <sup>4</sup> And, behold, the word of the LORD *came* unto him, saying, This shall not be thine heir; but he that shall come forth out of thine own bowels shall be thine heir. <sup>5</sup> And he brought him forth abroad, and said, Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be. <sup>6</sup> And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

#### Finally, Sarai suggested "Plan B" ... Abram's biggest mistake!

Genesis 16:1-2 Now Sarai Abram's wife bare him no children: and she had an handmaid, an Egyptian, whose name was Hagar. And Sarai said unto Abram, Behold now, the LORD hath restrained me from bearing: I pray thee, go in unto my maid; it may be that I may obtain children by her. And Abram hearkened to the voice of Sarai.

13 years later God gives Abram his miracle (and changes his name) ... but Abraham has a difficult time believing after such a long delay

<u>Genesis 17:17</u> Then Abraham fell upon his face, and laughed, and said in his heart, Shall *a child* be born unto him that is an hundred years old? and shall Sarah, that is ninety years old, bear?

Abraham is so familiar with his mistake he can't see his miracle!

<u>Genesis 17:18</u> And Abraham said unto God, O that Ishmael might live before thee!

Sarah laughed at the whole situation, because she couldn't believe

<u>Genesis 18:13-14</u> And the LORD said unto Abraham, Wherefore did Sarah laugh, saying, Shall I of a surety bear a child, which am old? <sup>14</sup> Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son.

# Isaac and Ishmael (Abraham's miracle and his mistake) grew up in the same house for awhile! (wheat and tares – Matthew 13)

Romans 7:18-25

18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but *how* to perform that which is good I find not. 19 For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do. 20 Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. 21 I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. 22 For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: 23 But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. 24 O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? 25 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

# On the day Isaac came to maturity, Ishmael mocked him (if you don't deal with your mistake, it will eventually mock your miracle!)

<u>Genesis 21:8-9</u> And the child grew, and was weaned: and Abraham made a great feast the *same* day that Isaac was weaned. <sup>9</sup> And Sarah saw the son of Hagar the Egyptian, which she had born unto Abraham, mocking.

# Abraham loved Ishmael ... it's a sacrifice to walk away from some thing you thought you had to have and put it out of your house!

<u>Genesis 17:18</u> And Abraham said unto God, O that Ishmael might live before thee!

<u>Genesis 21:10-11</u> Wherefore she said unto Abraham, Cast out this bondwoman and her son: for the son of this bondwoman shall not be heir with my son, even with Isaac. <sup>11</sup> And the thing was very grievous in Abraham's sight because of his son.

## And finally, God asks Abraham to give his miracle back to the Lord!

<u>Genesis 22:2</u> And he said, Take now thy son, thine only *son* Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of.

## When he does, God multiplies his miracle to bless others!

Genesis 22:16-18 <sup>16</sup> And said, By myself have I sworn, saith the LORD, for because thou hast done this thing, and hast not withheld thy son, thine only *son*: <sup>17</sup> That in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which *is* upon the sea shore; and thy seed shall possess the gate of his enemies; <sup>18</sup> And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.
