Dear members and friends of Centennial,

On October 29, 2017, we will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation in Europe. Notice that I said the <u>beginning</u> of the Reformation. When we look at events like Martin Luther nailing his 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg as simply a snapshot in time -- I believe we do ourselves a disservice. And we do a disservice to those reformers who 500 years ago began something new and revolutionary. You see, renewing the Church, reforming the Church can never be a one-time event in history.

In a hymn from Evangelical Lutheran Worship by Fred Pratt Green, we hear this message loud and clear. "The church of Christ in every age, beset by change but Spirit-led, must claim and test its heritage, and keep on rising from the dead." This is most certainly true. We live in a time and place far different from Luther's Germany of 1517.

I think it's similar to the way we should view our sacred scripture: If all we care about is defining Christ, confining Christ to first century Palestine, we miss the Good News that he brings. Fortunately Christ cannot be contained, confined to a brief moment in time. He is alive, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, the living Christ guides us in everything we do.

It is in this eternal spirit of Christ that we Lutherans once again celebrate the Reformation. We will do this on this 500th anniversary by worshiping. For Christians, it always begins in worship. It is there that we are joined by the Holy Spirit in Word and Sacrament and sent back into the world to spread the Gospel of Jesus. On this festive occasion, we will ask God to consecrate our stewardship of time, talent, and financial resources in Christ's name.

On October 29th we'll once again give our estimates of financial giving for the coming year, 2018. You will receive an estimate of financial giving card in the mail. We ask that you prayerfully consider your response and bring the completed card with you to worship on Reformation Sunday. This exercise of intentionally stating our estimated giving was graciously embraced by our members last year. We received an estimate from a majority of the worshiping families of Centennial. This year, our worship time will be followed by a celebratory meal in Luther Hall.

There is a great deal of spirit and hope here at Centennial as we prepare for a challenging future, proclaiming God's Word in this time and place. Our new sign and recently re-sealed parking lot are examples of how your offerings are being used. And the addition of Jaime Frazier as Coordinator of Faith Development completes our staff, as we continually strive to serve you, the people of our church.

Please join us on October 29th, and continue to give generously as we welcome our challenging future with the certainty of Christ's love for the world.
