READ 1 SAMUEL 17:34-36

David vs. Goliath is one of the most famous stories in the Bible for a reason—David went up against a giant because he knew God would help him win. And that's exactly how it (and Goliath) went down!

But there's something else hidden in this incredible account that you can read in 1 Samuel 17. It turns out that David and Goliath is also a story about uniqueness. Uniqueness is discovering who God made you to be so you can make a difference

Read the paragraph again from verses 34-36. David had some pretty gnarly real-life experience dealing with lions and bears that tried to attack his sheep. Can you even imagine running after a lion or a bear to get your sheep back? David could! And he knew God would give him that same kind of strength to go up against Goliath.

The heavy armor might work for Saul, but it wasn't right for David. Instead, David went with what he knew: five smooth stones from the river, and his sling. And the rest is history.

God made David to be David—just like He made you to be you. David had the confidence to fight Goliath because he already knew how to fight off ferocious animals. But at the same time, David knew he had to fight the giant his way (not covered in clunky armor).

Ask God to help you learn what makes you totally unique.

THINK ABOUT IT:

- 1. What makes you unique?
- 2. Why do you think God made you that way?
- 3. Have you ever tried to be someone you're not? Why do you think that' so hard not to do?

Have you ever heard of a lemming? It's a kind of rodent that lives in the

The funny thing is, lemmings tend to act as a pack—so much so that they'll even follow each other off a cliff. That's right! They'll jump into the ocean together to try to find a new habitat.

The thing is, all of us want to fit in. We want to be part of the crowd. And that's not a bad thing, necessarily. But it can be a bad thing if it causes you to stop being YOU. If you have to try to be someone you're not in order to fit in, that should be a big warning sign. You don't want to end up like a lemming!

Spoiler Alert: Everyone feels the pressure to be part of the crowd. But it's no fun to be just like everyone else. Our differences make life interesting.

Besides that, there's an even bigger reason why you should be confident being you. As a believer in Jesus, you have the opportunity to shine a light with the good things you do. Other people will be curious about why you act differently (in the best possible way!). You can tell them it's because of the difference Jesus has made in your life.

Be confident shining your unique, one-of-a-kind, brilliant light!


HELLO MYNAME IS...

It's easy to think, "No one really knows me." OR "No one understands the REAL me."

We get labeled all the time. People might think they know what we're like, but really they only know a tiny piece of us. And you're way more complex and way more wonderful than other people realize at first glance.

On the other hand,

God knows ALL about you.

Look at what Jesus said in this verse: that He knows how many hairs are on your head! That's just crazy!

FUN FACT: IT'S SOMETHING LIKE 100,000, BY THE WAY. MAYBE YOU'VE GOT 101,246. BUT THE ONLY ONE WHO REALLY KNOWS FOR SURE IS THE ONE WHO MADE YOU!

The point is God knows every detail about you, inside and out. He loves you so much and He knows just how unique you are. You can go to Him anytime and tell Him what's really going on, because He knows you better than you know yourself! And this verse is proof that not only does He *know* you—He *cares* about you deeply.

Don't be afraid to share with God what's going on with you on the inside.
