APOSTLES' PORTAL In Acts 1: 8 we hear Jesus say to his apostles: "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth." For centuries the apostles have served as examples of faith for the church in both their great faith and their humble roots. floor of the church. In architectural terms a portal refers to a grand entrance of an important structure. The Apostles' Portal reminds us as we come into the church that we are entering holy space. Similarly, when we exit the church we are sent out to be Christ's messengers in the world. The funding for the Portal came from Memorial gifts and a number of generous donations made to the project. MOBILE FOOD PANTRY AT LOWELL ELEMENTARY On February 26th, and every 4th Wednesday of the month (between 2:30 and 4:00), Central will

be sponsoring a Mobile Food Pantry at Lowell—a need identified by the principal, Cynthia Hale. We are partnering with Roadrunner Food Bank. They will deliver food for 50 families. Food will include meat, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy products, and bread. Families will be able to "shop" those products—about 50 pounds per family.

Central will provide volunteers who will unload pallets of food, set up food for distribution, assist families as needed. Several members of the Serve Team at Central have visited three mobile food pantry sites and have come away very moved by the program and its value to families in need of good food.
