Dear Friends,

The year 2013 made us reflect on the simplicity of God's faithful providence. In many ways we were surprised.

Humbled, we realize how the Lord uses students who at first do not appear to be promising candidates for ministry. Take Cheng, not his real name, who is a low key kind of a person who came to the seminary a few years ago, looking apprehensive and somewhat reserved. He appeared to be pulling back as he faced our admission counselors. Cheng was seeking God's direction for his life. Clearly he knew he had a mission to do. On the same note, it was obvious he was not sure he was ready to deliver. He cautiously enrolled. Shortly thereafter Cheng became gravely ill with the dreaded dengue fever. I thought he would just quit. But Cheng moved on. He recovered strong from that illness and stepped up as a key leader of our international student community that keeps getting stronger every year. It was in 2013 that he flourished.

It is amazing to see students like Cheng who started slow but then blossomed in a way one could never imagine. He and Pastor Henry, the student featured in a previous prayer letter, would rather be 'wall flowers'-unseen, unnoticed, and just in the background. But it is truly the humble that God exalts. One cannot see much promise to start with, but God sees so much more.

In July, it was difficult to make provisions for the classes I had just started teaching in order to return to the US on an early home assignment to help with our mom Marjorie. God made a way through internet technology and others who covered our non-teaching responsibilities. It is difficult to know how to best approach mom's illness and needs. We find ourselves on the receiving end of encouragement and support from family and friends as well as from various Christian communities...from all of you. Please keep praying for wisdom in this area.

We were startled to see how fast the grandkids had grown! They boosted our energy levels and reminded us to <u>never lose sight of life's many wonders</u>.
