The First Sunday of Advent

The Exclusive Claim of Christianity

The exclusive claim of Christianity about Christ is not centered on our belief that Jesus was right about God. It is centered on our claim that God was fully present in Christ to reconcile the world to Himself (2 Cor. 5:18). It is the theological claim about Jesus (that He is God) that makes the spiritual claims of Jesus potent. Jesus' words are right because those words are God's words (Jn. 14:10b). Jesus' "way" is not superior because it promotes a higher ethic or because it champions values that resonate with our spiritual sensitivities. Jesus' way is true because in Him we find God drawing us to Himself.



Advent Wreath

The word "advent" means "coming." The first purple candle, known as "The Prophet's Candle," signifies the hope of the coming Messiah seen in the prophecies of the Old Testament. "Hear now, O house of David! ...the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:13-14).

The most important thing in all the world is our relationship with the living God. Hence, the first four commands are devoted to this most central issue. Yet, our relationship with God necessarily shapes our relationships with fellow creatures made in His image. We begin to consider how this is so with respect to one of our most important human relationships in a message titled, "A Command with Promise."
