Symposium on Religious Persecution – We are living in days of challenge and opportunity. While our extended family of brothers and sisters throughout the world is enduring great violence, social and economic pressure and daily harassment, we here in America are beginning to see signs of these circumstances heading quickly in our direction. We must embrace our present situation with the sure knowledge that we are here by divine appointment. The crisis before us requires serious thought and preparation. The church is being called to faithful witness in a society that is increasingly hostile to Christian truth and values.

The ability to clearly articulate God's truth and the values flowing from Scripture is required if we expect to continue to have a seat at the table. It is unlikely that we will be willing or able to stand for the faith if we do not understand God's truth and incorporate its power into daily living. While we are citizens of another world, we are salt and light in the present one. Should God not choose to reverse the present course, our generation and those to follow will experience pressures totally unfamiliar to most of us. We do not have to be free or comfortable to be faithful.

In places like China, Iraq, Syria, African villages, Indonesian marketplaces, and Pakistani neighborhoods, believers are tortured and murdered every day. This is not our experience. Persecution in American will come initially in other forms. It is important to understand how this happens, what it looks like and how to brace for the fallout. God is leading us to places we have not been before, but He is not taking us to places where His grace cannot keep us and His Spirit cannot powerfully use us.
