"Could you not stay awake with me one hour?" These are the words Matthew's gospel records as spoken by Jesus to Peter in the Garden of Gethsemane. For many years one of the great Christian traditions throughout the world is to spend time watching and praying about our Lord's journey to the cross.

Our tradition at Christ Church is to make the Chapel available following the 7:00pm Maundy Thursday service (April 13) until the 7:00am Good Friday service (April 14). During this period, we offer one-hour increments to watch and pray. You may sign up to watch and pray or to serve as security so those praying will have someone else in the building with them at all times.
