


Ratio Christi: Campus Apologetics, by Jordan Andershock

Last fall, a new campus organization came to UT and quickly captured my attention. The name of this organization is Ratio Christi (RC) which means "The Reason of Christ." This group is dedicated to training people in Christian apologetics and equipping them for the different challenges they will encounter. The primary areas of outreach for RC are university campuses. The group has numerous chapters at many universities with UT being one of the newest. Since this is the UT chapter's inaugural year, the group had nowhere to meet. The CSC graciously allowed the chapter to meet in the annex on Wednesday nights.

Apart from the normal CSC activities, this is one of my favorite things that occurs at the Melrose house. Some of the things that RC has done this year include studies on many different groups including Muslims, Mormons, and Scientologists with a focus on how to effectively minister to members of these groups as Christian apologists. We also cover different theological debates such as young-earth and old-earth creationism. One week, RC was able to acquire an actual, hand-copied scroll of the Torah which dates to the 1700s for students to examine. Sometimes, members will just sit and debate back and forth about different biblical questions we have for the entire session. As you can tell, the topics are varied. Regardless of what we are studying, however, we ensure that the goal of each session is to further equip us to help spread the message of Jesus Christ.

Ratio Christi also has several UT faculty backers and provides a way for students to interact with these Christian professors who they may not have known even existed. The UT chapter is led by Anna Kitko who has degrees in both Religion and Philosophy and is set to complete her Masters of Biblical Studies in 2017. Anna has been a phenomenal instructor and always offers insightful and biblical answers to the many questions which our group discusses. She is an incredibly hard worker and has done a fantastic job of organizing RC for this first year.

This organization and its members have been a blessing and encouragement for me in my personal walk. I feel much more competent at addressing many seemingly complex issues which have entangled and pulled many of my peers away from God.
