HYMN HUNT

Searching every musical nook and cranny! (well, maybe not EVERY...)

Nooks and crannies: any part of section of a given place, especially those that are hard to see. Nooks are generally high and crannies are generally low. (Definition: Thefreedictionary.com)

When I think about nooks and crannies I think about hiding places where people may have stored treasures of one form or another. One of my favorite activities is to go into a thrift shop and search the nooks and crannies for bargains or treasures not noticed by others. Some days I'm successful, other days, not.

The church's musical heritage is absolutely brimming with treasures in it's hymnody that are often tucked away and forgotten. I'd like to bring out a few of those dusty hymns from their nooks and crannies and share them with you again. Let me establish what you may already know. I am no church music expert, but I do have a crazy fascination with hymnals! I've looked and studied many hymnals of our Lutheran church bodies as well as hymns that come from the broader church. Some hymns have not withstood the test of time and belong buried—deeply buried. Other hymns may need to be dusted off and reworked a bit and they could serve the church again. Some hymns are new and have simply not found their way into our repertoire yet. I'd like to examine some of all of these types with you. (My hope is to also put samples of these hymns being sung on our church Facebook page each week.)

I hope you will journey with me on Facebook through these church music nooks and crannies to seek the beauty of the gospel of Jesus Christ found in the hymnody we sing!

Next week's hymn: "O God O Lord of Heaven and Earth," Martin Franzman (This hymn even talks about crannies!)

Dear Friends,

I am writing today to inform you that, after much prayer and careful thought, I have decided to retire as Bishop of the Metropolitan Chicago at the end of my current term, on August 31, 2019. I will not be standing for re-election at the 2019 synod assembly.

In the spring of 2007, I made the decision to open my hand to whatever God had in mind for the next phase of my ministry, and, quite unexpectedly, this position of leadership was placed in that open hand. Now, to be true to my own teaching and my own belief about faithful Christian living, it is time to open my hand again and to release this trust back to the Church for the sake of our mission to the world on Christ's behalf and in Christ's name.

I cannot overstate the honor and gratitude I feel for the opportunity to be the steward of this office. However, in the rapidly-changing mission field around us, I believe that it is time for a fresh perspective and new leadership imagination to carry the work forward. I have chosen to make this announcement now so that I can talk about it openly in my 2018 report to the assembly, and so

that you will have ample time to pray, to engage in open conversation together, and then to discern who God is preparing to be the next bishop, to guide you, to pray for you, and to learn from you for the next six years.

In the meantime, we will still have more than a year to continue the work we have begun. I pray that this may be a time of joy and hope as we live toward our common call into God's open future.
