Psalm Chants

In addition to singing metrical psalms and hymns, Redeemer church also practices an ancient form of psalm singing called chanting which is likely similar to how the psalms were originally sung by David, Asaph and the people of Israel. We use ‘tones’ which are simple melodies that allow us to speak the actual words of the Psalms together in a simple melodic way.

The Psalms are printed in this worship guide with marks to indicate when to change notes. All of the words before the (|) mark in the text are sung on the first whole note. Then the following two or three syllables are sung to the remaining three notes before the bar in the staff below. At the end of the first line of text, a (*) corresponds to the same mark (*) on the staff below. All of the words of the second line before the (|) in the are then sung to the whole note after the bar in the staff below. Then again, the following two or three syllables are sung to the remaining three notes at the end of the staff (see below)

So the first verse of Psalm 85 is printed like this:

LORD, you were favorable | to your land;



you restored the fortunes of | Jacob.

The words “LORD, you were favorable” are all sung on the first whole note. Then the words “to your land” are sung to the second, third, and fourth notes of the tone.

Then the words “you restored the fortunes of” are sung to the second whole note and the word “Jacob” is split among the last three notes in the tone so it sounds like “Jay – ay – cob”

Then at the end of each psalm, we add the *Gloria* using the same tone:
