### **Forgiveness**

In my life, there have been times when I was severely hurt by a few people who I loved and trusted. At those times, people would come up to me and say things like,

"I can't believe that they did that to you!" "How could they be so mean spirited?" Some would ask "Aren't you hurt by this?" I would put up a good front and try to assure them that I was doing fine and that I was



not hurt. But the truth was that I was deeply hurt and offended. Even to this day there are times that I struggle with forgiveness issues. How about you? Do you find it hard to forgive? Many times what happens is that we will think, "I was mistreated by that person and so I am justified in my non-forgiving behavior." And so we sit, soar and soak in the offense and un-forgiveness. And sometimes it even feels good as we plot a way to get our revenge.

The trouble with this is that not forgiving is one of the greatest impediments to growth as a Christ follower—so says Jesus Christ and He ought to know! This even includes forgiving those who are not seeking your forgiveness.

So how can I let go of the pain of an unforgiving heart?

Then there is the other side of this forgiveness issue. What about the times that we have wronged someone?

What do we need to do to receive forgiveness? What if it is a circumstance that makes it impossible to ask forgiveness of the person you have wronged? Some have tried unique ways to confess and seek forgiveness. There are websites that allow people to post a confession and ask for forgiveness—all the while remaining anonymous.

During the month of September we will be looking into the perplexing and, many times, difficult subject of forgiveness. We will learn what Jesus had to say about it and what other places in the Bible record about it. But more importantly, we hope to discover some ways to actually forgive those who have wronged us—as well as find ways to be forgiven by others and by God.

Join us this September as we begin the fall season with opportunities to be freed from the burdens that surround unforgiveness.

### Campaign Nonviolence: Building a Culture of Peace

Watching the news on TV or reading a newspaper quickly makes us aware of the violence that surrounds us. Recent stories have focused on a stabbing at the Mississippi Valley Fair, the execution of five women in India who were accused of witchcraft, a New York Jets' quarterback being sidelined with a broken jaw after a teammate sucker-punched him, and sentencing for the man who was convicted of killing 12 people in a Colorado theater. Although we may feel very concerned about the violence occurring around the world and in our local communities, it's difficult to know what we can do. Yet, as Christians we are reminded that "God blesses those who work for peace." (Matthew 5:9) But where do we start?

For several months CARE Ministry has worked with a number of other ministry areas to plan a series of activities that focus on developing peaceful relationships. Christ Church is one of four Illinois sites participating in Campaign Nonviolence, an international effort focused on building a culture of peace. Events are scheduled throughout the week of September 20<sup>th</sup> with activities for all age groups. In addition, our pastors are planning a sermon series on peace, and the Good Sheep and children's Sunday School classes are busy preparing art projects that will be on

display during September.

"It isn't enough to talk about peace. One must believe in it. And it isn't enough to believe in it. One must work at it" (Eleanor Roosevelt). A few years ago we found ourselves wondering why we never had any money

despite having a good income. Erin started looking into budgeting programs to get a better handle on things and stumbled across Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University. As it turns out, a series of classes was starting the next week at Christ Church. At this time we were not yet attending Christ Church. This is one of the on-ramps that Roger often speaks about. Erin attended the classes each week and Mike got on board soon after by

listening to the cd's. We took a good hard look at our finances and made some changes such as cutting cable, getting rid of the gym membership we rarely used, and eating at home more often. We

weren't attending church at this time therefore weren't giving but we started attending not long after getting

into the classes. It was clear to us that it was important to give and honestly many times it was a struggle but we did it faithfully each week. We try to give even if we aren't going to be at church. Although we'd made headway since adopting the Financial Peace principals we were eager to do more to get ahead. We prayed on it, and agreed that we needed to sell our large (keeping up with the Joneses) home and move into a more modest one. One of Dave Ramsey's sayings is "live like no one else so you can give like no one else" which has

always resonated with us. God really had a hand in this decision as we had three offers after our first and only open house. During the same week, one of Erin's co-worker's let her know that a friend

would be putting a house up for sale soon in the range, location, and type we were looking at. We were able to see the house before it was listed and it was perfect for us. By making this move we were able to pay off all debts except for a house payment which is now much lower. We were also able to double our giving want to continue to work on increasing. We are so passionate about this program that we've agreed to facilitate Financial Peace University this fall. 
