



- 3. To elect Leadership Council officers (Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer) and three (3) at-large representatives;
- 4. To hear and act upon any other business brought before the congregation.

A quorum of 20% of the church membership is required to conduct the business of these meetings. Copies of the relevant documents will be distributed by email and made available from the church office in advance and on the day of the meeting.
