

About the music

Michael Horvit wrote Even When God Is Silent in 1988 to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of Kristallnacht, the night of November 9-10, 1938, on which over 250 synagogues as well as shops and cemeteries in Germany, Austria and Czechoslovakia were destroyed, many people killed and over 30,000 people arrested and incarcerated. Legend has it that the text was found written on a cellar wall in Cologne by someone hiding from the Gestapo.

Notice of Special Congregational Meeting: Sunday, November 19, 2017

The Bylaws of the Church of the Redeemer specify that a congregational meeting to approve the budget for the coming year shall be held on a Sunday in November, with such date to be designated by the Leadership Council. A quorum of 20% of the church membership is required to conduct the business of this meeting.


