Here's a look at what's happening in terms of worship. Be sure to note that on February 11th we are worshipping at Spring Glen UCC!




which marks the official beginning of the liturgical season of Lent. Lent is traditionally described as lasting for forty days, in commemoration of the forty days Jesus spent fasting in the desert, according to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, before beginning his public ministry. Many of us may have grown up participating in the practice of "giving up" certain luxuries in order to replicate the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. For others, daily devotionals have become an important part of our Lenten prayer practices. However you have observed Lent in the past, I invite you to truly think about how you might mark this time of year.

This year, I will be inviting the children to participate in a Lenten practice that I refer to as "30 Pieces of Silver." In Hebrew culture, thirty pieces of silver was not a lot of money. When Judas Iscariot bargained with the leaders of Israel to betray Jesus, he asked, "What are you willing to give me if I deliver him over to you?" They then counted out for Judas "thirty pieces of silver" (Matthew 26:15). That's all they considered Jesus to be worth! So, although we know that it does not equal a significant amount *financially*, it's *true* significance cannot be measured.

Before Lent begins, every child will receive a small cloth bag. These bags will be used to collect 30 coins (30 pieces of silver) over the course of time between Ash Wednesday and Easter. They will be invited to pick a person, place, world event, etc. to pray for each time they put a coin into their bags in hopes that they will take the time to truly understand the importance of marking this time of the year. On Easter morning, the children will collect the bags and donate the coins to an organization of their choosing. In this way, our Easter donation will be born out of our Lenten prayers.

If this is something you would like to be a part of as well, please let me know! I have plenty of bags! If you can't participate financially, I hope that you will take time to pray for the children of Redeemer as they take part in this important prayer practice.



FILM SCREENING: "Life on Parole" Tuesday, February 6

The Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy at Central Connecticut State University presents a film screening and conversation on "Life on Parole" at Best Video Film & Cultural Center (1842 Whitney Avenue, Hamden) on Tuesday, Feb. 6, 2018. The event starts at 7 PM and is free and open to the public.

"Life On Parole" is a new documentary that looks behind the scenes of Connecticut's efforts to change the way parole works and reduce the number of people returning to prison. Produced in collaboration with the New York Times, the film follows four former prisoners as they navigate the challenges of their first year on parole. The film will be followed by conversation with former parolees and current criminal justice professionals.
