Classis Huron met on Wednesday, May 13, 2015 at Waterloo CRC All Churches in Classis Huron were represented. Rev. Amanda Bakale of Waterloo CRC led Classis in a time of devotions focused on singing, speaking and praying praise to God, and hearing God's Word from Mark 6. The Credentials Committee reported that all Classis Huron churches are represented. Classis is declared constituted with Rev. Henry Steenbergen as Chair and Rev. Amanda Bakale as Vice Chair. With the concurrence and approval of the Synodical Deputies, Classis approved the requests of Rev. Tom Van Milligen and Rev. Chris Pool for a one year extension re their eligibility to receive a call as per C.O. Article 17c, as well as the request of Rev. Jack de Vries for a two year extension re him being 'on loan' to the Christian Reformed Church of Australia. Classis also approved the new 'job description' for the Stated Clerk as recommended by CMC, resulting in amendments to Section 13 in the Rulers for Classis Huron. By motion made and carried, Classis approved the work of CMC, AdCom and the Stated Clerk. Classis approved the 2014 Financial Statements as circulated with the Agenda. Classis heard from a number of Committees and received their reports for information. Classis dealt in detail, resulting in lengthy discussion, regarding the report from Classis Home Missions Committee regarding a possible church plant in Fergus. At the conclusion of the discussions Classis approved the motion: That Classis Huron approve the work of the Home Missions Committee and support its plan to plant a church in Fergus. The Home Missions Committee also recommended, and Classis approved, the appointment of Rev. John VanderStoep [formerly the pastor at Maranatha CRC, Cambridge as the new 'church planter' in Fergus. Candidates John Medendorp [called to Community CRC, Kitchener] and Tim Leferink [called to Lucknow CRC] were both examined for ordination as Ministers of the Word. They each openly shared both their faith, and their faith journeys. With the concurrence of the Synodical Deputies, Classis thankfully declared that both had sustained the exam, and welcomed them as new pastors in Classis Huron. The installation service for John Medendorp is set to be held on Sunday, May 21, at 10:00 AM at Community [Kitchener] CRC. The installation service for Tim Leferink is set to be held on Saturday, May 30, at 1:00 PM at Lucknow CRC. The day ended with prayers of thanksgiving and praise for God's faithfulness to His Church. Next meeting of Classis Huron is set for September 16, 2015, at Bethel CRC, in Listowel. Classis approved extending the credentials of Rev. Siemen Speelman re his eligibility for call under C.O. Article 17c, until May 2016. This decision received the concurrence of the Synodical Deputies, subject to the Stated Clerk receiving a written request for the extension. This request has now been received.
