PEANUT BUTTER DRIVE TO START MARCH 1



For more than 30 years Lifeline Christian Mission has been working to meet the physical and spiritual needs of people around the world while involving people from the United States and Canada in the ministry work of fulfilling the Great Commission. Founded in 1980 by Bob and Gretchen DeVoe, Lifeline began serving in Haiti and today it's ministry extends to at least 8 countries or people groups, ministering to tens of thousands of people on any given day and engaging thousands of people in Great Commission work weekly.

Lifeline Christian Mission is doctrinally aligned with non-denominational independent Christian Churches and Churches of Christ. We believe that by the grace of God, having heard and obeyed the Word, man can have salvation. One must repent, confess, accept Christ as Lord and Savior, and be immersed into Christ, receiving the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and continue to live in accordance with Christ's teaching. We believe the Bible is the inspired and inerrant word of God.

Lifeline Christian Mission relies heavily on the peanut butter they receive from the annual drive for nourishment for the area. Why Peanut Butter? It is high in protein. Six tablespoons is equivalent to a 3 ounce pork chop in protein. Protein is lacking in the diet of most Haitians. It is rich in vitamins and minerals like vitamin B & E. Malnourished children and pregnant women are given a jar weekly. Start looking for sales to stock up now. If we all brought in just 2 jars each it would really add up. Thanks in advance for helping with this important drive.

We don't have to go to Haiti to have a positive impact on others lives!
