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The nursery is primarily a place of prayer for young children. However, it is also a place where they hear foundational Bible vocabulary through song, simple truth statements, and the reading of Scripture as they form their language skills.

The Gospel Project

Toddlers-Kindergarten

The Gospel Project is a three-year, Christ-centered Bible study that follows a chronological timeline of Bible events—presenting the story of redemption through Jesus like kids have never seen it before! Each week, these stories come to life through video, music, activities, and more.

The ABC's of God

1st-2nd Grade

Right thinking about God is essential for the life of faith. Using the alphabet as a framework for teaching the attributes of God, this study explores the delight that God has in Himself as the source, means, and purpose of all things. Each lesson asks and answers three key questions, "*Who is God?*" "*What is He like?*" and "*How should I act toward Him?*" as it presents a theology of God for children.

To Be Like Jesus

3rd-4th Grade

What is salvation? How does someone become a Christian? What does it mean to become like Jesus? This curriculum helps answer these important questions by explaining elements of the Gospel message, its purpose, and promise. A major portion of this study focuses on the doctrine of sanctification - the process by which a Christian becomes more and more conformed to the likeness of Jesus.

My Purposes Will Stand

5th-6th Grade

The goal of *My Purpose Will Stand* is to reveal God and His glorious work of providence. It is our hope that through the Holy Spirit's work in the teaching of His Word, students would respond to God in faith as they look for God's providence in all things— meditating on His works, seeing the big picture of God's work in the world, and seeing the hand and heart of Jesus in all circumstances of their lives.

So What's the Difference?

7th-12th Grade

The topic of manhood and womanhood is still strongly debated today and still greatly impacts our society. For Christians there is no doubt that the Bible must be the last word. But what does it teach about true manhood and womanhood? In what ways are men and women essentially the same? In what ways are they essentially different? And how do these differences affect our roles in the home, the church, and the wider society? Noted pastor, author, and Bible scholar John Piper positively and sensitively looks at these important questions for both men and women. Our desire is that this study will inspire and encourage our youth to live out their unique differences in a fulfilling, godly way.

Teach, Take & Tell

2's-3's

Teach, Take and Tell is a one year, 12-unit children's systematic theology for use with two and three year olds. It focuses on twelve key biblical truths. The same Bible story and truth are presented each week of the four/five week units, allowing the children to master the concept and story. Action rhymes, songs, games and crafts reinforce and add variety to this basic core lesson.

The Kingdom Catechism

PreK-1st grade

The Kingdom Catechism's Q&A format is a natural teaching method that makes learning interactive and easy, especially for children. Children have the remarkable capacity for memorization. This catechism provides them with a mental structure for understanding God, the Bible, and what it means to be a Christian. It is our hope that with the help of the Spirit, the children will come to understand the beauty of these great truths.

The Praise Factory

2nd-4th Grade

The Praise Factory is a six year, multi-age children's systematic theology curriculum for elementary school children. It is comprised of 104 key biblical truths -- called "Big Ideas"-- divided into 16 units, common to a systematic theology. Within each 3-week Big Idea, there is an Old Testament, New Testament and Church History/Missions story presented. Each week's curriculum includes 8 different activities to reinforce the Big Idea concept and story.

Your Word is Truth

5th-6th Grade

The goal of this study is that, through the work of the Holy Spirit, the authoritative Truth of the Bible might be understood and embraced so students may see and interpret all of life through the Truth of Scripture.

Youth Bible Study

7th-12th Grade

Our youth are being taught to inductively work through scripture. The students are led verse by verse through a book of the Bible. The goal is to teach the youth to search the scriptures on their own by asking the crucial questions of meaning and application. This is a great time of fellowship as they allow each verse to speak for itself from the overall context of the Bible.
