Thinking It Over

Can you recall a time in your life in which you experienced failure? What kinds of emotions did that experience cause?

Read Matthew 5:23-41. Think about the specific instances Jesus mentions. Have you ever been in a comparable experience? How did you react?

Exploring the Text

This passage reminds us of two things Jesus had done – **1. He raises the bar.** As Jesus reminds us in Matthew 5:43-48, anyone can seek revenge. How are Christians expected to act? In what ways does Christianity raise the bar for our behavior?

2. Jesus moves from legalism to relationships. The point is not to measure out exactly two miles when you “go the extra mile,” but to do more. Why is legalism so tempting?
