Students will be housed at the church, serve in the community, eat, worship, and experience what it means to Give Back locally.

Dates: June 17th – 21st, 2019

- Check In will begin on June 15th @ 1:00 PM
- Closing service will be on June 21st @ 7:00 PM

Registration: online registration will begin on March 10th

Costs: \$100 per student

- Covers meals, student curriculum, & t-shirt

Logistics

- Students will stay at the church each night
 - Unless an emergency, students will not be allowed to leave
- Shower trailers will be available (toiletries not provided)
- Meals will be served at the church and on work sites
- Transportation to and from work sites will be provided

Q&A

Q. Does the \$100 cover all cost?

A. Yes, the \$100 registration fee covers all student costs.

Q. Where will the students sleep at the church?

A. Sleeping arrangements will be finalized at a later time; however, girls and boys will be divided by buildings and by age.

Q. What will students need to bring?

A. Bible, air mattress, sheets/blanket or sleeping bag, toiletries, etc. A final packing will be provided later.

Q. What will a typical daily schedule look like?

A. Tentative daily schedule would include:

Breakfast @ 7:00 AM

Depart for worksites @ 8:00 AM (lunch and crew devotions on site)

Depart from worksites @ 3:30 PM

Dinner @ 6:00 PM

Worship @ 7:30 PM

Church group devotions @ 9:00 PM

In rooms @ 10:00 PM & Lights out @ 10:30 PM

Q. Will there be opportunities for parents/adults to volunteer?

A. Yes, absolutely! Adult volunteers will be needed to stay overnight with students, lead work crews, transport students to work sites, lead group devotions, operate sound equipment, prepare meals, and be available as runners.
