- 4. Read <u>John 19:5-11</u>. What was Jesus answer when Pilot said that he had the power to crucify Jesus? Why is this answer significant to you and I?
- 5. Read Romans 13:1. Where does any and all authority come from? With this truth in mind, how should you view the different authorities in your life?
- 6. How can the truth that God is the One who has all authority and power help you deal with people, places, and things in your life?

MOVING FORWARD

This means:

- There are no such things as mistakes with God. He doesn't and can't make them.
- Nothing about you is a mistake to God.
- Nothing or no one has power over you that God does not have power over.
