ORANGE Philosophy

The church has approximately 40 hours a year to influence a child, while parents have about 3,000 hours a year.

When the church (Yellow - Light) partners with family (Red - Love), we create a brilliant Orange.

By leveraging the influence of parents and finding ways to partner with them in leading their child's spiritual development, we are able to show kids who God is more effectively than each of us could do alone.

Orange Strategy

Create A Safe Place.

- 1. Value acceptance (celebrate everyone equally)
- 2. Value confidentiality (what's said in the group stays)
- 3. Value honesty (encourage real answers)
- 4. Respect the process (let them be kids)
- 5. Guard the heart (look for opportunities to let the Spirit lead)

Be Present.

- 1. Show up predictably (be consistent)
- 2. Show up mentally (be ready)
- 3. Show up randomly (be where they are)

Move Them Out

- 1. Move them to someone else (they need other leaders)
- 2. Move them to be the church (they need to feel significant)
- 3. Move them to what's next (they need to be ready)

The 3 Hurts

1. Hurting Themselves

If a student is inflicting self-harm (cutting, suicidal thoughts/language, addictive behavior, emotional harm), inform John and/or Matt. If it is an emergency, promptly contact the parent and/or authorities

2. Hurting Others

You must put an immediate end to any form of bullying. We must create a safe place. Bullying can be seen in language, social media, or physical behavior. Please inform John and/or Matt about the incident.

3. Being Hurt

If you notice abuse, contact John and/or Matt immediately. This can be seen in bodily injuries or emotional pain through conversation.
