# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Waiting is not one of my favorite things to do. I am not a very patient person, and I like things completed and finished so I can move onto whatever needs my attention next. And waiting is really hard when we are waiting for something especially important, something longed for, something we are expecting.

During the season of Advent, we are waiting for the coming of the Christ Child. The beginning of the church year and the season before Christmas is a very important one that is all too often forgotten because everyone is anxious about getting to Christmas.

During this season we wait with all of Israel for the promised Messiah, the One who is to bring amazing and hopeful good news to the oppressed and bind up the brokenhearted. (Isaiah 61:1).

We gather and we wait -- we wait with assurance, knowing already about the birth of Jesus, born to a simple carpenter named Joseph and his teenage bride Mary in a rustic manger. We gather and we wait, knowing already about the cross and the resurrection, the ending and the promise. Christ has already come, yes? But as Christians we wait for more; we are especially called to wait because Christ will come again. No one knows the hour or the day even though there are people in all ages that try to predict His coming again. Regardless, it is clear that knowing the when isn't what we are to focus on. Rather, we are called to wait expectantly. You might wonder—what does that mean to us? To wait expectantly for us in all of our lives' circumstances, to wait in this time between already and not yet, to live in the here and now, and to live like He is coming again in the very next moment. Get our lives in order, do the things

that will bring us closer to God -- the things that challenge us to know ourselves deeper as children of God.

It always amuses me how New Years is a time for people to make resolutions, and many times the resolutions are around making changes that will make the individual healthier and happier. This year for Advent, let us resolve to be in conversation with God. Pray to God requesting guidance and help so we are more open to God's presence in our lives, and create in us more grateful and thankful hearts. Pray that God helps us to take refuge and have trust in God and in our faith instead of the things of this world.

This is a difficult season for many -- especially those that have lost love ones this past year. The first Christmas after a death can be as grief-filled as the actual time of the loss. We become so busy during this time that we might miss a chance to be just what a person needs on a difficult day -- a simple hug, a call or even a card. Please take the time to let folks know that you care and that their loss is not forgotten during this difficult time.

Lastly, to help us stay on track during the Advent season we will be offering Wednesday evening communion worship services at 7:00 PM on 4, 11 and 18 December in our sanctuary.

The theme for the services will be *Advent with Charles Wesley*, and we will focus on one of his hymns each week.

- •Week 1 Come Thou Long Expected Jesus (Coming Birth of Christ)
- •Week 2 Hark, the Herald Angels Sing (Birth of Christ)
- •Week 3 Lo He Comes With Clouds Descending - (Coming Return of Christ)



Please come and be refreshed and re-centered during this Advent season. We all need the reminder of what our focus should be during this season and not get completely caught up in the panic spending mode of our culture.

My hope for you and your family is that you have a safe and spirit-filled Advent and Christmas!

# **COUNCIL NOTES**

The Council met on Monday, 18 November at 7:30PM. The next Council meeting is scheduled for 16 December at a time to be determined.

- The Treasurer reports that year-to-date giving and expenses for the church are about equal.
- •The CrossRoads Child Development Center (CCDC) reports proceeds over \$75,000. This amount is after paying its share of expenses including utilities and \$25,000 in rent to DUMC (\$2,500/month). The 2013 CCDC net proceeds are being distributed as follows: \$2,000 for scholarships, 10% Social Needs and Outreach, 30% Building Fund Continuing the Vision and 60% Trustees Reserve up to \$40,000. Since beginning operations, CCDC has contributed \$162,000 to the Trustees Reserve account which has been used for various projects around the church.
- •Nelson Outten is chairing an ad hoc committee formed to determine the best way to handle the church accounting. This determination involves the Treasurer position, bookkeeping and other accounting needs. Russ Smith will be stepping down as Treasurer at the end of the year. We owe Russ a great deal of gratitude for serving for many years providing dutiful oversight of the finances and accounting operations of both DUMC and CCDC.
- •The Worship Committee is developing plans to replace the sound system in the Fellowship Hall.
- •The 2014 DUMC and CCDC operating budgets are being finalized and will be approved at the December Council meeting.
- The Trustees have requested all users of the church be mindful of locking doors, turning off lights and lowering thermostats when leaving the church buildings.
- Chuck Sparks will begin serving as Council Chair in January, and we look forward to supporting his leadership.

It's been five years since initially being asked to chair the Council, and I feel honored to have served the congregation with so many dedicated servants of the Lord. Thank you!

This will be my last Council Notes update, and we'll also be putting down the welcome sign in December. Many of you have asked about why we wave on Sunday mornings. In an effort to get to know the congregation a little better five years ago, I started greeting the 8:30 worship service and others as they pass the church on Sunday mornings with an 8' WELCOME sign (later joined by my cousin Dave). We've gotten to know many of you through a smile and a wave--we actually try to see how far off we can recognize you by identifying your car. Persevering through all types of weather, we can often tell the mood of our community on Sunday mornings. Some mornings we would get several horn blasts and some mornings several vehicles would pass before getting a wave. We've greeted cars, trucks, motorcycles, bicyclists, joggers and even someone on horseback. Work vehicles almost always wave, and everyone is in a better mood on sunny Sundays. It's been fun...

## TREASURER'S REPORT

#### DUMC

Financial reports for the ten months ending 31 October reflect a near breakeven condition when comparing offerings and other revenues to operating expenses. Our statements indicate a slight loss of only \$178, but compared to 2012 at the same time, the loss was \$22,980. The turnaround of \$22,802, is attributable to an increase in offerings and other revenues by \$11,174 along with a reduction of expenses of \$11,628, most of which is from less spending by the Trustees.

All known liabilities and payables have been satisfied as of 31 October, and the church has adequate general reserves to address a financial emergency should such an incident surface. The church also holds additional funds which are designated for specific purposes and can be expended only for the intent which they were created. A report of all funds will be provided to the Administrative Council during the next meeting scheduled for 16 December.

#### **Endowment Fund**

The Endowment Fund has grown greatly during 2013. We began with a balance of \$247,245, and as of 31 October, the balance has increased to \$345,703. The increase is the result of additional investments from the Building Fund in the amount of \$52,000, with the remaining amount coming from dividends and share value increases amounting to \$46,458. The Fund is segregated into two sections. Most of the Fund (83.8%) is held as an escrow to build new church structures at some point in the future with the remaining amount being undesignated but intended for special purposes. The policy governing disbursements from the fund are:

Less than \$25,000. - requires Administrative Council Approval

Greater than \$25,000. – requires the approval of a church conference

The Fund is administered by a five member committee as listed in the Charge Conference Program Booklet. This is an excellent location for anyone interested in making special gifts to the church and/or naming the fund as a recipient of one's estate. The church office can be contacted for further details.

#### Budget/Stewardship For 2014

Our church is currently in the midst of the annual stewardship campaign. DUMC's operating expenses will reach \$400,000 for 2014 and represent an increase of \$25,000 over 2013. Member pledges are necessary in order to plan for the many ministries planned for 2014. Anyone interested and who has not responded with a pledge as of this date, can contact Lee Matousek (Stewardship Chair) or the church office.

#### CrossRoads Child Development Center

Financial results for CCDC have been above target for the first ten months of 2013. Revenues have reached \$491,574 with operating income netting \$75,842 compared to a budgeted income of \$71,587. Earnings from CCDC are distributed to the Church Building Fund, the Trustee Reserve Account for capital expenditures, and the Social Needs committee to carry out charitable programs primarily in Anne Arundel South County. The allocation of the proceeds is determined by the Administrative Council on an annual basis.

This is my final report for The Lamplighter as DUMC Treasurer. It has been a challenging and interesting experience for the third time. I am ready, as I'm sure others are, for a change in the Treasurer's position. I only hope and pray that with God's help, our church fully embraces the mission statement adopted in 2013, and DUMC achieves everything for which it is capable.






