Course Description: This course is designed to expose the student to the major doctrines of the Bible. Each doctrine will be studied in an organized and connected manner. The goal is to create in each student a tightly knitted theological system, which you can use to discern truth from heresy.

Course Objective(s): The primary objective of this course is for students to increase their knowledge of the 10 major doctrines covered so that you will be more confident in what you believe and why you believe what you believe. Students will examine several critical scriptures concerning these 10 major doctrines of the Christian faith in order to distinguish between truth and heresy.

Assignments:

- ➤ Quizzes 200 Points (There will be 10 quizzes)
- ➤ Reading 100 Points (A reading log will be submitted by **March 19th**)
- ➤ Homework 100 Points (2 papers will be assigned)
- ➤ Class Debate 100 Points (Class will be split into teams and given a topic)
- ➤ Class Participation 50 Points (You are expected to be appropriately vocal and participatory in class. Based primarily on attendance)

Make-up Assignments: Any quizzes missed must be made up during office hours or by appointment. Late papers will be assessed a 10% penalty per week.

Attendance Policy: In accordance with the Detroit Bible Institute policy, all students must attend a minimum of 10 classes in order to receive credit for the course. Excused absences are at the full discretion of the instructor and will not count against the student. In the event that a student does have an excused absence, the instructor reserves the right to assign extra homework and reading assignments to make up for lecture time missed by the student.

Grading Policy: Students must complete a minimum of 75% (**413** points) of all coursework in order to pass the class.
