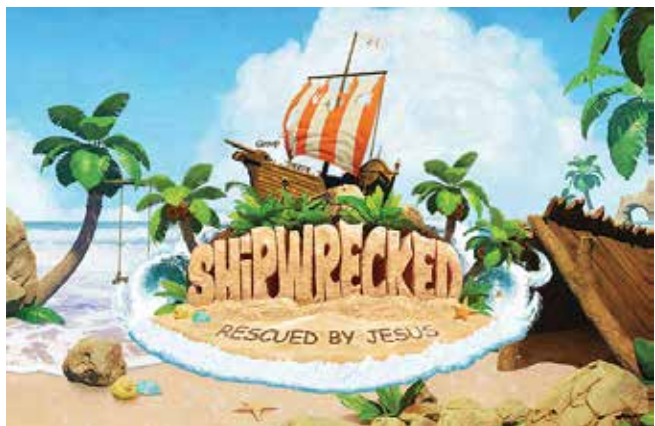

Little Einstein Summer Camps

Christian Beginnings Preschool and Kindergarten is offering **Little Einstein Summer Camps** at Duluth First UMC during the months of June and July. Camps are for kids ages 1 thru 5. Camps will be held:

- June: June 4th, 6th, 8th, 25th, 27th, and 29th;
- July: July 9th, 11th, 13th, 16th, 18th, 20th, 23rd, 25th, and 27th.

Camps will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays. There is a \$30 registration fee. Camp costs are \$180 per child for June, and \$270 per child for the month of July. **Please note all fees are non-refundable.**

In order to attend **Little Einstein Camp**, children must be registered at the **Christian Beginnings Preschool and Kindergarten** for the 2018-2019 school year. You must commit to a month or more of camp to attend **Little Einstein Camp** and space is limited!

Summer Reading Camps

This summer Christian Beginnings Preschool and Kindergarten is offering reading camps for children ages 5 through 7. Led by Nancy Carpenter, **Christian Beginnings’ Kindergarten** teacher, **Leap Into Reading** will focus on the alphabet letters and their sounds, reading strategies, handwriting practice and so much more!

Leap Into Reading camps will be held the weeks June 4th and 25th, and the weeks of July 9th, 16th, and 23rd. Camp days are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. each day.



There is a \$30 registration fee. Camp costs are \$240 per child for the June camps, and \$360 per child for July. Please note - all fees are non-refundable. Campers will need to bring their own lunch, and snacks will be provided.

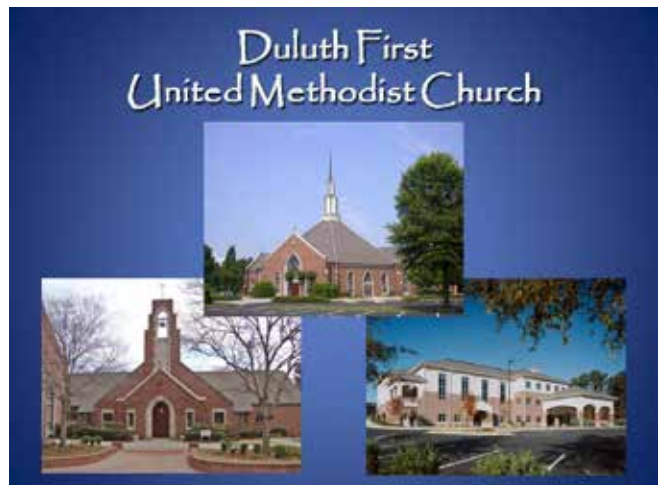

Girl Scouts Are Collecting Seeds for Puerto Rico: Through May 20th

Rebekah Patterson from **Girl Scout Troop 1935**, a Troop supported by Duluth First UMC, is working towards her Silver Award, the highest award a Girl Scout Cadette can earn. In order to earn a Silver Award, girls must identify an issue they care about, explore their community to determine ways to help, develop their project and be sure the project is self sustaining.

Rebekah's Silver Award group is collecting seeds to send to Puerto Rico's farmers. Because of the recent hurricanes Maria and Irma that devastated the island, Rebekah's Silver Award group decided they wanted to help. They are collecting and sending these varieties of seeds:

Arugula, Asian Greens, Basil, Beans, Beets, Bell Peppers, Bok Choy, Cabbage, Chili Peppers, Cilantro, Cucumber, Cover Crops, Eggplant, Kale, Lettuce, Okra, Oregano, Parsley, Passion Fruit, Radish, Squash, Sweet Corn, Tomato, Turnips, Watermelon, and Zucchini.

These seeds will be distributed by the Caribbean Youth Environmental Network in order to re-establish family farms and gardens all over Puerto Rico.

Please help us by bringing seed packets to church and putting them in the Silver Award donation buckets located in the Narthex, Gathering Room and 1st floor office area of the Family Life Center. **Seed packets will be collected until Sunday, May 20th.** Rebekah and her group would greatly appreciate your help. This summer our Education Ministry is offering **Summer Smarts**, study opportunities to gain knowledge to feed your theological mind. If you did not grow up Methodist, or perhaps just missed out on a piece of crucial information about our denomination then two United Methodist Studies may be of interest to you. Baptism – “By Water and the Spirit”

Brady Beard, a Candler Graduate student, will lead a study about the sacrament of baptism as understood in our United Methodist Church. The book is a resource to understanding between the baptismal covenant and daily discipleship. The cost of the book is \$10 or also available on Amazon to download to your Kindle for \$8. Suffering from a Strained Relationship?

Relationships with loved ones can have their ups and downs. Misunderstandings, dis-agreements and moments of frustration and hurt feelings will happen because we're all human. But when a relationship deteriorates to the point of being disrespectful and filled with hurtful words or actions, we are heartbroken! Equally upsetting is the total silence of a loved one as if the relationship is non-existent. The decline of a once loving relationship is devastating and the pain and sadness of it all can consume us.



Over time, a strained or unhealthy relationship with a loved one can take its toll on us if we don't address our feelings of heartache, anger, rejection, guilt, or not being able to forgive. These negative feelings can torment us and impact many of our relationships. While it's not easy to share our private life with others, it's important to talk to some-one. By giving voice to our pain and concerns, we're better able to find clarity and begin healing our brokenness.

Consider talking with a Stephen Minister.

Because many **Stephen Ministers** have experienced the impact from a strained or un-healthy relationship, you'll be talking with someone who truly understands your pain and heartache. Your specially trained **Stephen Minister** will create a safe place for you to confidentially share and explore bottled up feelings and concerns. While a **Stephen Minister** will not fix your relationship, you will have a confidant to help you find hope and healing. You'll also have someone praying for you every step of the way.
