Pastor Kegel's Message

This weekend we will be celebrating All Saints' Sunday. The actual day is November first (that's why we celebrate Halloween when we do-as All Hallows', All Saints' Eve.) On All Saints' the Christian Church remembers and gives thanks for those who have gone before in faith, both those known to us all and those only known to God. Here in Church we will remember those who have entered the Church Triumphant during the last year. But All Saints' is a day to give us courage as well as for remembrance. We are encouraged in our faith because we know that God is with us now and will never leave us or forsake us. Our final destiny is assured because of Christ. We will have eternal life with Christ and all those who have believed in him.

John Ruskin, the Victorian literary critic wrote in his diary, "I was in doubt about the foundation of my house. So I took a candle and went down into the cellar and ascertained that all was perfectly safe. Since then I have lived in the pleasant upper parts of the house." Commenting on this, Frank Meade wrote, "Too many of us today live in the cellar of our lives, counting the black beetles, shuddering over the spiders, bemoaning the dampness and generally tormenting ourselves in the darkness." We do not need to be afraid. We can set our worries and cares aside. God cares for us and those we love. God will make sure that we have a place with all the saints in the Kingdom of God.

Why We Share the Peace

Repentance also finds expression as neighbor-love in the community of Lutheran worship. Lutheran churches have a tradition of confessing sins aloud together in part to recognize that the sin of an individual always affects the whole body. This liturgical act of repentance as "turning to others" is repeated, or perhaps completed, as we share the peace.

The sharing of the peace finds its roots in Jesus' teaching from the Sermon on the Mount where Jesus explicitly connects "turning to others" to our worship of God. Jesus says:

"You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and whoever murders shall be liable to judgement.' But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgement; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to council; and if you say, 'You fool' you will be liable to the hell of fire. So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first to be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift." (Matthew 5:21-24)

This is why the Exchange of Peace is often located before the Offering and the Meal. It provides not only a chance to exchange friendly greetings, but also an opportunity to resolve conflicts—to give and receive forgiveness. Jesus' instructions reveal his deep understanding of human nature. Where our relationships remain strained or broken, it can be nearly impossible for us to freely and joyfully "offer our gift" to God—or to anyone else.
