#### Pastor Marvin Wojda Lead Pastor's Annual Report 2014/2015



During my sabbatical I had several days completely alone at a northern Saskatchewan lake with my Bible and a notebook. I was drawn to Paul's letter to the Colossian church and spent time studying and praying through the Book of Colossians in preparation for an upcoming series.

Paul had never personally visited the church at Colossae but he expresses his love for them in 1:3, "We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ when we pray for you because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all the saints..." Paul captures my thoughts about Elim Church. I'm grateful to God for this church and I am constantly encouraged by the stories of faith in God and love for people that this church expresses.

In January I was humbled by the outpouring of love and honor as we celebrated the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our time at Elim. As I reflected in my comments on that occasion, over the years this church has taught me much, endured me much and forgave me much. For a pastor to serve in a church for so many years is a testament to the greatness of the church and its people.

#### **Staffing Changes**

This year we saw a number of changes in the life of our church. After a number of years where there have only been staff additions we saw two of our long term staff transition. We said goodbye to Pastor John Morris in the Fall and then in February we celebrated the life of our dear friend, Pastor Bob as he graduated to glory after more than 50 years of fruitful ministry. We welcomed Pastor Dominic, Pastor Tyson, Pastor Brent and Pastor Ralph to our staff. Elders Lillian and Ron Sprentz transitioned to the pastoral staff of the Rock Church.

#### **Building Expansion**

When we moved into our facility in 2012 it was a facility that had been reduced by almost 10,000 square feet from the original plan. In June 2014 in a congregational forum our leadership was encouraged to move ahead with plans for completing the construction of our building. This past year we've met with Children's ministry leaders and several of our pastors and others for input into what our building needs are and what needs we anticipate in the years ahead. In the spring we met with the architect and are well on our way to finalizing a concept for an addition that includes a chapel, additional children and youth ministry areas along with dedicated music ministry space.

#### **Adding a Saturday Night Service**

For seven weeks in March and April we did a trial run of offering a Saturday Evening Service. We saw 150-180 every Saturday night and the consensus was that we offer this option on a permanent basis starting Fall 2015. Our average weekend attendance was up 9% from the same period in 2014.

#### **Missions**

We were delighted to realize at the end of December that your 2014 missions giving significantly exceeded our goal. This enabled us to take on several missions projects that were waiting in the wings. I'm grateful to our missions committee for their work. Thank you Enid Pierce, Jan Andreae, Carly Morris, Gary Morris and Sandy Wiebe. We are also thrilled to welcome Pastor Ralph and Carrie as they serve in supporting and promoting missions at Elim.

I'm grateful for all of our staff that I get to serve with, with special thanks to the Lead Team; Pastors Blaine, Russ and Shawn. I'm grateful to our Board of Deacons, women and men who serve diligently to provide oversight and governance to our church. I'm grateful for Sharlaine's ongoing support and encouragement.

This past year I've completed terms of service on the boards of Wycliffe Canada and OneBook. At our National Conference of the PAOC I was elected to serve on the national board (General Executive) of the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada. Serving outside of Elim gives me a view into the larger work of God around the world.

# Pastor Blaine Eagle Senior Associate & Music Pastor Annual Report 2014/2015



Reflecting on this past year fosters a deep gratitude for all of the things God has taught us, brought to us and entrusted to us as a music and worship department. He has taught us to trust Him by walking with us in difficult situations. He has brought us into His presence when we honor Him with our songs of worship and with our lives. He has entrusted us with a recognized voice in our community, allowing us to share His love with many who don't know Him yet. He has allowed us the privilege of leading worship to this congregation of believers. Jesus, for all of this and more, we give You thanks.

At the centre of the music ministry is our worship leading choir. This group is a congregation within itself – a body of believers that ministers upward to God, outward to each the audience they are in front of, and inward to each other.

Our Christmas musical production continues as the largest endeavor of the year. Anne and I had the privilege of producing the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Elim Church Christmas Celebration in December. Our special musical guests were returning favorite Leon Leontaridis as well as our very own Chelsea Mahan, with many of our own vocalists also featured. The chapel was transformed into a beautiful, inviting Hospitality Center where many guests came to meet a Pastor, have questions answered and receive a Christmas book about Jesus. We estimate a total of 400 people came to the Hospitality Room over these four days. Thank you to Shannon Blais for preparing a huge amount of baking to help us welcome these guests. The Christmas Celebration had a depth of impact that was measurable and I thank everyone involved for their over-the-top passion, effort and excellence.

Other highlights included seeing the prayer ministry of the choir soar to new levels, weekly Sunday worship ministry and the Easter weekend of Good Friday and Sunday services. We ended strong with a June worship concert, and I am so thankful to this choir and musicians for presenting a full year of quality ministry that remained strong through the end. Thank you to the talented and dedicated pool of excellent musicians that minister capably, willingly and with the anointing of God, week after week. Thank you to the Tech team that helps us to effectively present that which we have worked so hard on.

I am enjoying my role as team leader to the adult ministries department. Pastor Murdoch continues to deliver effective ministry to this congregation and his respective report is included in the Annual Report. However, we have also gone through some significant changes this past

year which have been both challenging and rewarding. Pastor John resigned his position effective Oct.30, 2014, so it was necessary to begin a search for our Community Engagement Pastor. A special thank you goes to Darryl Bryant and his wife, Jodi, who have given effective, caring and Godly leadership to The Mix as we were in transition. I am happy to report that after an extensive process, Pastor Ralph Peters and his wife Carrie joined our staff on June 1, 2015. Pastor Ralph will care for Community Engagement as well as The Mix, and give primary direction to our First Impressions Ministry. Secondly, it was with heavy hearts that we said goodbye to Pastor Bob Tauber, who bravely fought a brief but fierce battle with cancer. After searching for the right candidate, we were able to invite Pastor Brent Cooper to join our staff in the Pastoral Care position, which includes New Dimensions, hospital visitation, and Men's Ministry. Pastor Brent and Roxanne began serving on our team April 1, 2015. It is a pleasure to have these two fine men join our Pastoral Team. Personally, I am continuing with my studies through Briercrest Seminary towards a Masters Degree in Leadership and Management, which is part of my commitment to lifelong learning and development.

Thank you to my wife, Anne, who not only supports me but also ministers in her own gifting alongside of me. We have experienced some personal challenges this year as Anne continues to recover from her year of illness. Last year's surgery, chemo and radiation treatments were effective but draining, yet we have known the uplifting prayers and practical love of God's people in this church. God is with us and we are assured and comforted by His presence.

#### **MEN'S MINISTRY**

In February, the men gathered for a supper and talk by General Superintendent David Wells, who shared his experiences ministering as chaplain to the Canadian Olympic and Commonwealth Games teams, and challenged us to reach out to a lost and hurting world.

Ron Sprentz led the Conquer study, and this was strongly supported gathering close to 30 men studying together over a 6 week period.

#### **DISCIPLESHIP CLASSES**

The mid-week classes continued to be offered, including Elim 201, 301, and 401, and the Bridges, Outreach to Muslims class. This will be reviewed with the intention of exploring what else might be offered that could attract greater numbers.

#### **JFFF**

The Jesus Our Firm Foundation Fellowship of Pilipino believers continues to meet on a biweekly basis, and we are grateful to those who provide leadership to this group.

## Pastor Brent Cooper Pastoral Care & Single Adults Annual Report 2014/2015



In February of this year, Pastor Blaine Eagle presented me with a unique opportunity to serve as both the Pastoral Care Pastor at Elim Church (part-time) and as the Chaplain at Elim Lodge (part-time). This is a unique partnership between the Lodge and the Church. I commenced my ministry on April 1 after nearly 9 years as the Chaplain at the Regional Psychiatric Centre. As I prepared to join the Pastoral team at the church, I was very mindful of the faithful and effective ministry that Pastor Bob and Jan Tauber had provided over the previous 10 years. Pastor Bob certainly left a legacy and it is my hope and prayer to build upon the foundation that he laid.

My main areas of oversight are: pastoral care and visitation, SALT, Men's Ministries, the Heritage Service, New Dimensions, the Senior Tones and the Tuesday Night Chapel Service at the Lodge.

#### **New Dimensions (September-May)**

We held 8 luncheons this past year. I had the privilege of assisting with the organizing and leading of the luncheons in April and May. I would like to thank Pastor Blaine and Anne for working alongside the New Dimensions Committee during the interim period. I would also like to thank the following people for serving on the committee this past year: Susanna Hingston, Mary Anne Clarke, Ron and Rowena Schneider and Sharon Thompson. I would also like the many people who pitched in with help in various areas of the luncheons.

#### **Heritage Service**

The 9:00 am Service in the Chapel is close to capacity each Sunday morning. While the congregation is predominantly seniors, there are others who attend because of the choice of worship style and time allocation. Over the past several months, we have averaged 90-95 people in this service. I would like to give thanks for those that assist in the Heritage Service – Joyce Kirkpatrick, Wilma Schmidt and Jessica Semper with the music; Al and Cindy Lawson, Matt Hoggan and Ron Schneider with the ushering.

#### **Chapel Service - Elim Lodge**

Each Tuesday night, we hold a Chapel Service at the Elim Lodge. There is an average of 30-35 in attendance. On the last Tuesday night of each month, we have communion together.

#### **Senior Tones**

Doreen Seeman gives excellent leadership to this choir which ministers in care homes throughout the fall and winter months. The choir is comprised of people from various churches across the city. I am the liaison between the Choir and the Pastoral Team.

#### **SALT**

SALT stands for "Single Adults Learning and Laughing Together." It has been a delight to give pastoral leadership to this ministry and to the excellent leadership team that has been assembled. This team consists of the following people: Shelley Venne, Brent Willis, Bev Hertz, Deborah McConkey, Kelly Jones and Charmaine Ens.

#### **Men's Ministries**

One of my ministry passions has been ministry and mentoring to men. I was very excited by the response that we had for the recently concluded Conqueror Series. We averaged about 25 men each night. In reviewing and evaluating this with the leadership team, we have decided to offer future discipleship opportunities in the upcoming year. I would like to thank the leadership team who has served so well over the past year: Dan Ukrainetz, Trevor Schmidt, Murray Fredlund and Cam Janzen.

#### **Pastoral Care and Visitation**

One of my ministry roles is to provide pastoral care through visiting folks who are hospitalized or shut-ins. This is for both congregational members of the Elim Church and residents of the Elim Lodge. There are a number of long-standing congregational members who are now shut-ins at various care homes in the city and surrounding communities, and are unable to attend services. I like to visit with them, offer them communion and encourage them in their faith. If you learn of someone who is hospitalized, please do not hesitate to contact the church office to let me know. I endeavor to keep my "ear to the ground" but sometimes someone will be hospitalized without my knowing of it.

Elim kids exists to partner with parents to reach children to know Jesus, grow in the Bible, and love people. Here are some highlights from this past year:

#### Curriculum:

We decided as a team that it was important to rethink the curriculum for the Kindergarten to Grade 5 kids. The curriculum team included Tera Codling, Jason Stianson, Pastors Angela and Rob. Many meetings and conversations occurred. This is a work in progress but some rewarding fruit is already beginning to become evident. Writing your own curriculum is very challenging and time consuming. Special thanks to Tera Codling for taking on the lion's share of this significant project. Tera is serving in her giftings with excellence.

#### Discipleship:

The definition of disciple is a follower or student of a teacher or leader, a personal follower of Jesus. Every Sunday morning at Kid's Church, every Tuesday morning at Wee College, every Monday night at Awana and Cubbies we see this happening. 150 dedicated leaders decided to show, teach kids about Jesus and the Bible during the 2014-15 year. #### **2015 ANNUAL REPORT**

Since our report in 2014, there has been a lot of activity next door at Hyde Park View. The official Sod Turning Ceremony with Mayor Don Atchison took place on Sunday, October 5<sup>th</sup> and construction officially began on November 17<sup>th</sup>. Since that time, the foundation has been laid and a significant amount of work has occurred. It will be obvious to anyone who has been watching, that the physical structure of Hyde Park View is significantly higher in quality than the typical apartment project around Saskatoon. With hundreds of tons of steel and concrete, this building will be solid and secure for decades to come.

To date, we have sold over 75 per cent of our life-lease suites. The age-in-place design has been extremely attractive to our buyers. Hyde Park View has numerous innovative design features that make it easier for a person as they age. Here are a few features we have included:

- Wheelchair- and walker-friendly 36-inch-wide doorways and wider hallways
- A 7-foot wide, barrier-free, no-step shower with controls at a lowered level
- In-suite laundry
- Three elevators, including one that is stretcher compliant
- A beautiful dining facility where meals are prepared by a Red Seal chef.
- Easy-to-use single-lever faucets
- Grab bars in bathroom(s)
- Flooring appropriate for wheelchairs, walkers and other assistive devices
- Floor-to-ceiling windows that offer views from a seated position
- Automatic door opening devices on all main entrance doors
- Secured entrance with video surveillance
- Speaker/entry system available through the phone
- Mail boxes at accessible height
- Comfort height toilets
- Numerous amenities, including an exercise area, library, meeting room, workshop, hair salon, large hotel style lobby, large outdoor terrace with hot tub
- Indoor parking with storage area

#### **Hyde Park View Rental Apartments**

On May 1<sup>st</sup> we began receiving applications. There will be a total of 15 rental apartments and we are accepting 75 applications. Application may be made through the website or at the Elim Lodge office.

Suites are subsidized and individuals will have to meet the total household income threshold of \$38,000.

All rental apartments are one bedroom and a den.

#### A Great Partnership

The staff and board of Elim Church have been extremely cooperative and helpful during the construction of Hyde Park View. There have been numerous favours that have been asked for and granted during the construction project thus far. We want to express our deep appreciation for this understanding and cooperative attitude.

#### For Elim Lodge Business as Usual

Elim Lodge continues to flourish. During the past five years we have had an unusually high rate of suites turning over—up to 35 suites in a single year. That means we have welcomed dozens of new residents to the Lodge. The community atmosphere and the great location continue to be a strong draw to our facility. An interesting fact to note is that we have a total of 226 residents, with 22 individuals who are 90 or older. We have one centenarian at 103 years young and two more that will turn 100 this year!

We often have inquiries about subsidized suites at Elim Lodge. The Lodge Board has developed an approach where we assist individuals with low incomes rather than have a static number of suites. Each year individuals whose income is under \$25,000 can apply for a rent subsidy. A large amount of money is set aside to assist those who need help most. We are currently taking names for life-lease suites and assisted living units.

We pay tribute to the following hardworking individuals who have generously given their time to the ministry of Elim Lodge / Hyde Park View. The **Elim Lodge Board** is Doug Tuomi (chair), Graeme Swinnerton (treasurer), Lorelie Barsi (secretary), Ray Jeanson, Garry Kadyschuk, Joyce Pitzel, Barbara Rackham, Russ Stare and Terry Schultz. The **Hyde Park View Building Committee** is Gord Pierce (chair), Shelley Davis, Menno Giesbrecht, Ray Jeanson, Kenton Miller and Greg Foley.

These individuals have had more than 100 building committee meetings plus dozens of other meetings of one kind or another. Our profound thanks to all the above individuals.

In conclusion, we affirm, value and appreciate our partnership with Elim Church, Pastor Marvin, the pastoral staff and the church board. Collaborating with individuals who strongly desire to serve the Lord and the community is a rare privilege.
