From the Pastor

Just As I Am... But Even Better!

Yet you are our LORD; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. Isaiah 64:8



Many years ago, my mother-in-law introduced me to a hymn that would become one of my favorite old, traditional hymns. You may know it...it's called "Just As I Am." While all of the lyrics are beautiful, I have always found the following verses to be especially meaningful...

Just as I am, though tossed about
With many a conflict, many a doubt,
Fightings and fears within, without,
O Lamb of God, I come, I come.
Just as I am, poor, wretched, blind;
Sight, riches, healing of the mind,
Yes, all I need in Thee to find,
O Lamb of God, I come, I come.
Just as I am, Thou will receive,
Will welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve;
Because Thy promise I believe,
O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

The idea that Jesus is with us whether or not we're afraid or doubtful... that we can find all the healing we need—body, mind, and soul—through Christ...that we are forgiven, accepted & renewed through Jesus' faithfulness...And that God promises to love us <u>Just As I Am (we are)</u>... **NO MATTER WHAT**...is beyond amazing!

But it's even better than that! Max Lucado is a favorite Christian author. His books somehow seem to touch our hearts through humorous and simple faith stories. One of my favorite books is called "Just Like Jesus." On the back cover it says:

From where did we get this idea that we can't change? From whence comes statements such as,

'It's just my nature to worry.'
'I'll always be pessimistic. I'm just that way.'
'I can't help the way I react. I have a bad temper.'

Such thoughts are not from God.

God can no more leave a life unchanged,
than a mother can leave a tear untouched.

God's plan for you is nothing short of a new heart.

God loves you just the way your are, But He refuses to leave you there. He wants you to have a heart like His. God wants you to be... Just like Jesus.

Now... if the idea of God changing you doesn't exactly sit well, then maybe it will help to think of it in one of these two ways...

If you're a parent, then no doubt you love your child just the way they are...but can you honestly say that you don't work to change them in some way? Don't you teach them and guide them and challenge them in the hopes that they become all that you know they have the potential to be? My guess is that you do...exactly because you love them so much, you want the best for them.

And if you're not a parent, you're still someone's child. Would you have wanted your parents to love you, but basically let you do anything you want? (Yes, I know it sounds tempting, but read on...) This would mean that, while they may not like it if you flunk out of school, they'd accept it because, after all -- that's "just who you are". It means they wouldn't give you any guidance when you acted out (whether or not you knew in your heart you needed it), because "that was just who you are". It would mean that they wouldn't challenge you to live up to your potential when your self-esteem might be low, because "that's just who you are." Doesn't sound so good does it? We want our parents to love us (and believe in us) more than that...more than we even believe in ourselves.

Well the same is true of our heavenly parent...

God knows us better than we know ourselves, and knows better than any of us what we are capable of being. God knows the gifts that we have been given, the ministry we are capable of, the mission that we are called to. And God believes in us even more than we believe in ourselves.

God loves us so much that He's not willing to leave us working at "less than our potential." So God gently, but firmly, guides us, molds us into the people we're intended to be...

Will what is molded say to the one who molds it, "
Why have you made me like this?"
Has the potter no right over the clay,
to make out of the same lump one object
for special use and another for ordinary use?

Romans 9:20-21

This <u>doesn't just apply</u> to us as individual children of God ...it <u>also applies to us as a faith community</u>, the people of God together at Emanuel!

As we have been praying together, worshiping together, serving together, and discerning together over this last year, we have been talking about, even dreaming about, where God might be calling Emanuel. What is the mission God is now calling you to—in this Manchester community and in the world? Where is your faith journey leading?

As children of God we are being guided & molded into the faith community that God knows we can be, intends us to be. God is working in us—changing us for holy purposes in this time and place. God will be challenging us little by little so that we might be transformed—as individuals & as a faith community—to be "just like Jesus."

No doubt it will be a little unsettling, sometimes frustrating, perhaps even a little scary...and it will certainly take longer than some of us might like ... but just think of what could happen if, instead of resisting whatever changes God might be trying to work in & among us, we gave ourselves over to this transformation—reformation—and allowed God to bring us to our full, faith-filled potential! What wonderful things God would accomplish in us and through us! God's work...our hands, feet, voices!

Just as I am, though tossed about With many a conflict, many a doubt, Fightings and fears within, without, O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

Keep the faith my friends! Look to Jesus... Pastor María

From the Parish Nurse

Last month I wrote an article about our automatic external defibrillator (AED) that is located on the wall next to the office entrance and I hope that you have all noticed where it is located. The first aid kit is located on top of the AED and the wheelchair is located beneath it.

If during any church event we should have a person experience symptoms of cardiac arrest or a heart attack, a person will be instructed to get the AED and bring it to the scene. While the person is retrieving the AED, someone needs to assess the person. If the person is unconscious, no pulse and is not breathing; one starts CPR. However, church is not the only place that a person may experience cardiac arrest so knowing CPR may save someone's life even someone in your own family. Therefore, the Emergency Management Team feels it is important to provide CPR training for our church community.

During the Emergency Management Training sessions, thirty one (31) people said they would be interested in attending a CPR course. I contacted Jason Race of R&M Associates LLC. His company services our AED and they provide CPR training. In order to have a class we need a minimum of eight (8) people. The class lasts about three (3) hours and the cost is \$45.00 per person. We would like to offer this class in January. If interested, please contact the Church Office or indicate your participation on the Connection Card.




The first meeting of the new year of the Prayer Shawl Ministry will take place on Monday, January 21, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. in Luther Hall.

Opportunities for Ministry during Worship at Emanuel



What is a lay minister?

A lay minister is a person whose spiritual gifts include the gift of service through hospitality and leadership. We welcome your participation in one or more of these important ministries. Together, they communicate God's grace to all. Ways to assist at worship:

- Greeters
- Ushers
- Acolytes
- Assisting Ministers
- Lectors
- Communion Assistants

Greeters



Greeters have the gift of hospitality, the ability to joyfully welcome and receive everyone. Greeters are the first people guests meet upon entering for worship. The greeters' welcoming smile and handshake "set the tone" for how guests perceive the attitude of the worshiping congregation.

Ushers



Ushers have the gift of hospitality by distributing worship bulletins and assisting with special needs of guests (i.e. assistive listening devices, cushions for your back). Ushers receive the offering and enter the attendance in the log book. After each worship service they return the sanctuary to pre-service order.

Acolytes



Acolytes who serve are typically from 6th Grade through High School. Their duties are:

- Light the candles at the altar prior to the worship service
- Collect the offering plates from the ushers
- Extinguish the candles at the close of the worship service

We also have Acolytes who are adults. Their duties are to light the candles prior to the worship service and extinguish the candles at the close of worship only.

Assisting Ministers



Along with the pastor, assisting ministers lead the congregation in worship by leading various parts of the liturgy (i.e., the Psalm, the Creed, Prayers of the People, Offertory Prayer, Post Communion Prayer, and Dismissal). Assisting Ministers at the second service assist the Pastor by distributing the host at one of the stations during Holy Communion.

Lectors



Lectors read the first and second lessons during the worship service. The lessons are emailed and/or mailed to you 10 days prior to the Sunday when you are reading so that you may become familiar with the readings. A lesson read well contributes greatly to the worship service.

Communion Assistants



Communion Assistants have the gift of hospitality in the distribution of Holy Communion. The 8:45 AM traditional worship serves Holy Communion at the altar railing, which utilizes two communion assistants – one distributes wine with a common chalice and one distributes wine and white grape juice with two separate chalices for intinction of the host. The 10:30 AM contemporary worship serves Holy Communion by stations at the front of the altar area, which

utilizes four communion assistants – one at each station distributes wine with a common chalice and one at each station distributes wine and white grape juice with two separate chalices for intinction of the host.



Training for each of these roles is offered for those who want it.

Scheduling is done on a rotation basis and the schedule is emailed/mailed to you, along with a list of substitutes and their phone numbers, prior to the beginning of each period. If you are unable to serve on your designated week, we would appreciate it if you can contact a substitute from the list.

In addition, MACC runs the Community Emergency Food Pantry, the Community Kitchen, Community Threads Thrift Shoppe as well as a Community Engagement Program. The Community Engagement Program focuses on outreach to the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless, as well as emergency services that address unexpected financial and medical needs of our community. MACC also provide meals to our local senior center, weekend snacks for elementary school kids, and support for families through the holidays and in emergencies all year round.

Transition Times

From Pastor Maria Hammons

TRANSITION TIMES UPDATE ... YIKES! Now WHAT?

- ◆ Call Committee Chairperson, Danielle Berneski, and Council Representative to the Call Committee, Lisa Little, informed the congregation on Sunday, December 16th, that after having had a number of meetings with the two candidates − including hearing multiple sermons − they believe that, while the candidates are both clearly good pastors in their current ministries, neither has the experience and gifts needed at Emanuel at this time. This decision was made after numerous hours reviewing both of the candidates' profiles, alongside the priorities and desires reflected in Emanuel's Ministry Site Profile created using the congregation's input. The Call Committee vote was unanimous.
- ◆ This is clearly disappointing as I know that you were hoping (as were they) that one of these two candidates would be "the one" the pastor that would lead and walk alongside of you in this next stage of Emanuel's journey. I know you are ready and anxious to move forward and I want that for you too. I understand your disappointment, even your frustration if that is how you are feeling but I am also sure that you would rather wait than end up with a pastor who may not be a good match.
- I ask you to try to set aside your disappointment and frustration and trust that we just need to be patient for a little longer as we wait for a new candidate who may be a great match for Emanuel's future. I truly do believe that the Holy Spirit works through the call process if we just make room for that work...and I believe the Holy Spirit was working through the Call Committee in their deliberations and decision. This truly is the time to believe in "*Emanuel*" to believe that *God is with us*.
- So...now what? The Call Committee will be meeting with Associate to the Bishop Paul Sinnott next week to provide additional feedback on the candidates and to provide additional input to guide the Synod's search for new candidates. Then the Bishop and Synod Staff will do additional research to see if new candidates may have become available in the past couple of months who may better meet Emanuel's needs. And then we wait to hear from Pastor Sinnott. As soon as we receive another candidate's profile, the Call Committee will begin their faithful ministry and keep the congregation informed.
- ◆ I know it's hard to wait...patience is not one of my virtues either. I think of all those sayings, like "Good things come to those who wait" but they just frustrate me more. But there is one "saying" that does often help me ... if I can be open to it...and that is... Be Still, and know that I am God. I remember those words from God, given to us in Psalm 46, and I take a deep breath and will myself to "be still". If that doesn't work, I pray for the patience and peace to "be still" and take another breath. Sometimes it doesn't work because I'm too intent on being impatient (smile)...but most of the time in that breath, in that moment I can "Be. Still." I pray that you can be too.
- Please know I am here for you for questions, for venting, for prayer, and for faith-filled assurance that God <u>IS</u> at work here, in and among the people of Emanuel, we just need to try to be patient, to trust and to pray "thy kingdom come, thy will be done."

During the drill, and in the case of an actual fire, everyone should exit the building quickly and cross Church Street to the parking lot. If Sunday School is in session, parents will be reunited with their children in the parking lot. Vehicles should not be moved until directed to do so by the Fire Department or members of Emanuel who are coordinating the drill.
