From the Pastor



COMMUN<u>I</u>TY I = Inspired to Serve

Jesus said, 'Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28)

In our reading of Matthew's Gospel we learn that first an angel, and then Jesus Himself, told Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to tell the disciples to meet him in Galilee. It was at this meeting (Matthew 28: 16-20) that Jesus told the disciples what they were called to do as people of faith. They were to make disciples of people in all nations, baptize in the triune name of God, and to teach those things that Jesus commands and had taught them.

As Christian people of faith, those who believe in the resurrection of Jesus the Christ, we are called to be the same types of witnesses. We are not one of the eleven in Galilee, but we have met Jesus at the empty tomb, and are called with the same authority as those who met him 2000 plus years ago.

We often talk about having God-given Spiritual gifts. Those particular gifts that God has given each of us—none of us have all of them, but all of us have at least one very special gift from God. Gifts that we are to use for the "building up of the church"...and to serve those in need in the world. Have you identified the gifts that God has given to you to help the church and the world?

Our Sunday School children and their families recently used one of their spiritual gifts—their love of art and painting (and rocks)—to create a beautiful **Rocks of Kindness Garden** along the sidewalk by Emanuel's parking lot.

In doing this, not only did they bring the joy of color and beauty to a previously bare spot along the road, but these rocks with their bright colors, fun pictures, and kind sayings of inspiration are there for the taking for anyone who passes by and needs a smile or some encouragement.

People from our neighborhood have already stopped and commented on how wonderful they think our "rock garden" is. If you haven't seen it yet – walk over and take a look.

Racism...Our Conversation Continues

If you were part of our Spring book study regarding racism, you will know that there was significant interest in continuing

From the Parish Nurse

I am happy to announce that Kim Boerner-Mercier, a Certified Reiki Master, will again be offering chair Reiki on the first Sunday of each month starting this month!

For those who are unfamiliar with Reiki, it is a Japanese "hands-on" technique for stress reduction and relaxation that also promotes healing. It is based on the concept that everything in the universe is made up of energy and this "life force energy" that flows all around us is drawn in by the body nourishing the cells, organs and glands. When one's energy is depleted, imbalanced or the flow is restricted by stress, injury, illness, etc., one is more susceptible to discomfort, further illness and disease. When one's energy is restored, free-flowing or balanced, one is more likely to feel relaxed and the body's own innate healing abilities are "jumped-started" and utilized for healing.

What does it feel like?

Although Reiki is "hands-on", unlike massage it is administered through a softer touch rather than a deeper pressure. While the person is seated or lying down and fully clothed, the practitioner's hands are placed along energy centers and pathways on



the head, neck, chest, abdomen, legs and feet similar to those used by acupuncturists. As energy is transferred to the body, the patient may feel warmth, coolness, gentle tingling or just deep relaxation. For those in final stages of life, it can also provide a more peaceful "transition".

The benefits of Reiki may include:

- Relaxation and stress reduction
- Relief of pain and muscle tension
- · A heightened sense of well being
- Increased energy





Adeebah; My Life, My Story Continues

A Muslim refugee from Homs, Syria, Adeebah's art evocatively depicts the torrent of emotions she experienced before fleeing Syria, during the family's four exiled years in Jordan, their ultimate arrival in the US on election night November 2016, and adjustment to this foreign land that is now 'home'.

An Artist's Reception, Talk Back, and Celebration will be held on Sunday, October 28, 6:00 – 8 PM, in the UUS:E Meeting Room. Focus will be two fold: the symbolism in Adeebah's art; and a celebration of author Jake Halpern, and graphic artist Michael Sloan, for their receipt of a Pulitzer Prize for the New York Times' emotionally powerful series told in graphic narrative form, Welcome to the New World. The work chronicled a Syrian family's arrival and struggle in the US, and is currently being developed into a full-length book.

Food at the reception will showcase **Adeebah's Middle Eastern Cuisine**, a catering business begun by this talented, entrepreneurial woman.

Recently, I've found myself thinking about all the "unsung heroes and heroines" here at Emanuel—who keep things going, even though there is no recognition or praise (or pay ©)! There are so many that come to mind; and while I know I won't remember all of you, I wanted to at least recognize the wonderful ministries that you do so faithfully!

Let's start with Emanuel's **Parish Nurse**, Lynne Gustafson, who shares her gifts of healing and hope, along with her medical skills and knowledge, with any of us in need. She cares for our homebound parishioners, visits those who are sick or lonely, and leads our healing prayers ministry. She is a fountain of information and knows more about Emanuel's parishioners than all of "we pastors" who have served here put together! She has also gone out of her way to build trusting relationships with city officials and nonprofit representatives to be able to better help in times of crisis and need.

The natural follow-up to Lynne's ministry is to remember the gifts of our **healing ministers**—who, on the first Sunday of every month, offer their time and gifts in healing prayer and anointing for those of us who feel a special need for hope and healing.

And there's our **prayer shawl team** who use their gifts to make beautiful, comforting shawls for those going through illness or another especially difficult time. Those who need healing and prayer.

There are ALL the **Sunday liturgical assistants**:

- The worship assistants who take care of the sound system and make sure the Pastor has a working battery (and that her mic is turned off when she sings ©);
- The **altar guild** that makes sure the linens are clean and pressed, the bread, wine, wafers and grape juice are available, the flowers are set up, and that everything is perfect for worship;
- Acolytes, ushers, greeters, lectors, assisting ministers & communion assistants, who lead us, assist us, and minister to us in worship.
- Our Anthem Choir and the New Day Singers, who—along with the many special musicians and our section leaders—share their gifts and provide beautiful music through instruments and hymnody.

On the more practical but so important side of the house there is our **Property Team** who keeps this beautiful old building running and maintained. These faithful stewards do so much that we take for granted. Ever wonder about the grass, the weeding, clean windows, plugged up holes, fixed doors, heating and a/c, or how about that new handrail installed to help parishioners as they descend after altar communion... where'd that come from? All this is courtesy of our faithful property stewards.

A new effort this year has been our **Emergency Management Team**. This small group of people has been incredibly busy making sure we are prepared for any event that may happen. You'll be hearing more about their important work very soon!

And finances...most of us would prefer to not have to think about our finances at home, let alone at church—so, thankfully, our faithful **Finance Ministry Team** takes care of that for us, along with our two gifted treasurers and financial secretary.

Let's not forget the **coffee hour hosts & fellowship folks** who work in the kitchen and make sure things are set up, cleaned up, and organized for all of our special events.

The list goes on as we add the many **volunteers who support our staff**...like Sylvia Helllstrom our very faithful, very unpaid staff member. Or those who help fold the newsletter and special mailings, or count the offering, and anything else that we need.

So, thank all of you for sharing your time, your energy, and your gifts with our Emanuel church family. You are an inspiration to all of us. Thank you for your willingness to serve <u>even when we take you for granted.</u>

Urgent need for U.S. to resume financial support to Augusta Victoria Hospital

Dear Congregations, Pastors, Deacons, and all of the New England Synod,

In recent days, I have read of the news that impacts our companion church of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land. Our brothers and sisters in the Lutheran congregations of Palestine are in danger of losing medical treatment through the East Bank Hospital System in Jerusalem.

The White House has made the decision to withhold \$25 million from the network that includes the Augusta Victoria Hospital. These are funds that have already received congressional approval.

Regardless of one's political affiliation, I believe that as people of faith we must put the welfare of people, especially the most vulnerable, above politics. Therefore, I am asking you to join with me, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, and Lutherans all across this church to write to the White House and your congressional leaders. Ask them to reinstate the funding for East Jerusalem hospitals.

What should I write?

As a person of faith who is concerned with the welfare of all people, I urge you to call for full restoration of humanitarian assistance to Palestinians, including the release of funds designated for the East Jerusalem hospitals.
