# CROSSWAY LEADERSHIP

Crossway Leadership is a program designed to inspire and equip students to develop Christian leadership characteristics from a biblical worldview. This program will motivate and help students live out their Christianity in every area of life.

Students will learn about subjects including; know what you believe, defending your faith, dealing with difficult people, time management, appearances aren't everything, and so on. These topics and lectures will come directly from Scripture.

Today, people compartmentalize much of their lives. In other words, people act one way outside of church and another way in the church. These actions are easily passed down from generation to generation. Our hope is that students learn how to live the "Cross Way." Here's what I mean: First, Jesus died on the cross so that sinners could be saved; therefore, people become Christians by the way of the Cross (aka the Cross Way). Second, Jesus called Christians to "Deny themselves, take up their crosses daily, and follow Christ" (Luke 9:23). Christ has called us to live the way of the Cross. Third, we should tell others the way of the Cross. The Bible tells us to "preach Christ crucified" (1 Cor 1:23; 1 Cor 2:1-2). It is imperative for Christians (especially young ones) to know the Word of God and to live it out. Crossway is designed to help students succeed in the things that truly matter.
